

## RESOLUTION NO. 2004-907

### **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE MUREAU ROAD PORTION OF THE U.S. 101 CORRIDOR INTERJURISDICTIONAL BIKE LANE GAP CLOSURE PROJECT.**

The City Council of the City of Calabasas does hereby resolve as follows:

**SECTION 1,** The Draft Initial Study/Environmental Assessment (IS/EA) was prepared and circulated pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the CEQA Guidelines.

**SECTION 2,** The document was circulated to the public for comment between August 30, 2004 and September 30, 2004.

**SECTION 3,** A public hearing was scheduled by and held before the City Council on October 6, 2004, and that all individuals and agencies were given the opportunity to speak and be heard on the sufficiency of the analysis in the Mitigated Negative Declaration.

**SECTION 4,** The IS/EA analysis of the proposed project concluded that with the implementation of the mitigation measures contained in the document, the proposed project would not have a significant effect upon the environment.

**SECTION 5,** After concluding the public hearing and considering all public testimony and discussing the document's thoroughness and accuracy, the City Council hereby finds as follows:

1. The Initial Study/Environmental Assessment has been completed in accordance with the City and State of California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines and there was adequate public review given to the Initial Study/Environmental Assessment; and
2. The Initial Study/Environmental Assessment adequately discusses all significant environmental issues and provides feasible mitigation measures that will ensure environmental effects are reduced to less than significant levels; and,
3. The MND reflects the independent judgement and analysis of the City.

**SECTION 6**, Based on the findings of the Initial Study/Environmental Assessment, the City Council hereby adopts the Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared for the Mureau Road portion of the U.S. 101 Corridor Interjurisdictional Bike Lane Gap Closure Project.

The City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this resolution and shall cause the same to be processed in the manner required by law.
