## **US ROUTE 101 LOST HILLS RD INTERCHANGE PROJECT**

### **NIGHT WORK NOTIFICATION**

This notification is regarding the planned night work on the Lost Hills Interchange Project in the next two months (November and December 2016). Some of the work can only be performed at night, when the SR 101 mainline freeway lane closures are allowed. Typical work that has to be done at night includes temporary striping and placement of temporary concrete barrier rails so that the work can be done safely behind them.

In addition, work access is sometimes not possible during the daytime for removal and hauling of the asphalt and concrete pavement as well as soil from the ramps that are being modified or relocated. Temporary closures of on- and off-ramps in both directions will be required during day and night time during this period of time.

Every piece of large equipment has to have a backup alarm per Cal OSHA safety rules. We will work with the contractor to minimize the amount of noise created by the back-up alarms at night but it cannot be eliminated completely. For the safety of workers, the contractor is required to illuminate the work area and prevent the work lights to blind the drivers on the freeway.

The Construction Schedule shows that existing NB on-ramp will be closed on November 04, 2016. The contractor is scheduled to start work on removing existing pavement and soil on November 06, 2016 at night. This work is in the proximity of the Saratoga Hills/Ranch Community and will not be possible without creating some inconvenience for the residents. This work should be completed within two weeks after the start date.

Additionally, during this stage, the contractor will be working next to the existing bridge and for safety reasons there will be absolutely **no pedestrian access allowed** to cross the existing bridge.

This night work is temporary and we will do everything possible to minimize the inconvenience to the residents. Please drive safely, use detours and public transit service and avoid the construction zones if possible.
