The City of Calabasas Library has activated more than 600 digital library cards for teachers of the Las

Virgenes Unified School District (LVUSD). Teachers now can use their staff IDs to access all digital

resources at the library, including e-books, databases, streaming video and language learning. Several years

ago, the Calabasas Library activated digital library cards for all students in the District. Now students and

teachers can work together on distance learning projects with resources provided by the Library.

The library offers free access to the New York Times, databases for research and digital e-books through

CloudLibrary and RB Digital. The RB Digital app also provides audiobooks, digital magazines, comics,

graphic novels and streaming video. A variety of classic and educational films are offered through Kanopy.

In addition, The Calabasas Library has an online language learning program called Transparent Language.

Digital resources become even more critical in ensuring a student's ability to learn during the COVID-19

closures. Many new free resources are also available to all citizens on the Calabasas Library website. For
