Calabasas Mayor pro Tem James Bozajian Named Vice-President of the Los Angeles Division of the League of California Cities

Calabasas Mayor pro Tem James Bozajian has been named Vice President of the Los Angeles County Division of the League of California Cities. Bozajian will be sworn in on Thursday, August 6, 2020.

Bozajian currently serves as the organization's Secretary/Treasurer, and in 2021 he will assume the role of President. The position can only be held by an elected municipal official in Los Angeles County, typically a City Councilmember or Mayor.

"I am honored to accept this appointment, and look forward to working with other public officials throughout California on the many challenges municipalities are presently encountering," said Bozajian.

Founded in 1898, The League of California Cities is a statewide advocacy and educational organization for all California municipalities. It is the largest organization representing local governments in the State of California and each of California's 482 incorporated cities holds membership. The League is divided into regional subdivisions; the Los Angeles County Division, with 88 incorporated cities, is the largest. Many prominent political leaders have served as President of the Division, including former Los Angeles City Councilmember and Mayor Tom Bradley (1968-69). Several local leaders have also served, including former Agoura Hills City Councilmember Fran Pavley (1995-96), and Calabasas City Councilmember Dennis Washburn (2004-05).

Since 2008, Bozajian has also served on the Board of Directors of the California Contract Cities Association (CCCA), the second-largest municipal organization in California, and was its President in 2011-12.
