- Planning Commission Appointment
- 3 Members and 2 Alternates
 - "...persons who, as a result of their training, experience and attainments, are qualified to analyze and interpret architectural and site planning information"
 - One member must be a licensed architect

ARP Purpose

 To preserve and enhance the beauty of the City's natural and built environment by:

Encouraging Citywide consistent building scale/character
Discourage development of individual, dominant buildings
To ensure development that is attractive and in-character of the city
Encourage structures which contribute to neighborhood and community

To ensure that:

Site landscaping provides visually pleasing settings for structures, Landscaping blends harmoniously with the natural landscape, Landscaping supports the design and function of the structures, Views of structures from off-site are softened or screened

- To encourage the highest quality of architectural design, green building and construction methods which are least disruptive to the site and to the community
- To balance private prerogatives and preferences with the public interest and welfare

 - 1 position open, to serve as the Alternate member
 - Suggested questions
 - Summary Of Experience and Credentials
 - Question regarding General Design Knowledge
 - Critique of a 'Hypothetical" Architectural Project
