SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

That the Council receive public comment regarding the assessment for the Landscape Lighting Act District Nos. 22, 24, 27 & 32. There is no recommended action at this time.

BACKGROUND:

The Landscape and Lighting Act of 1972 regulates the annual administration of special assessment districts. The City of Calabasas administers four Landscape Lighting Act Districts, as follows:

Landscape Lighting Act District No. 22: Calabasas Park Area (LLAD 22)
Landscape Lighting Act District No. 24: Lost Hills & The Saratogas (LLAD 24)
Landscape Lighting Act District No. 27: Las Virgenes Road (LLAD 27)
Landscape Lighting Act District No. 32: Agoura Road/Lost Hills
Commercial District (LLAD 32)

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

On April 28, 2021, the City Council approved resolutions initiating proceedings for the levy and collection of assessments within Landscape Lighting Act District Nos. 22, 24, 27 and 32 for Fiscal Year 2021-2022; approved a Preliminary Engineer's Report calling for an increase in the assessments for the Landscape Lighting Act District Nos. 22, 24, 27 and 32.

As a matter of policy, staff has requested that the Council hold a public meeting tonight with respect to the proposed assessment. This public meeting will give the Council and staff an opportunity to hear feedback from the community with respect to the proposed assessment and to respond to any questions members of the public may have. Tonight's public meeting is in addition to the formal public hearing that the Council will hold at the June 23rd, 2021 council meeting.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

The Landscape Lighting Act District Program is funded through dedicated special assessment funds.
