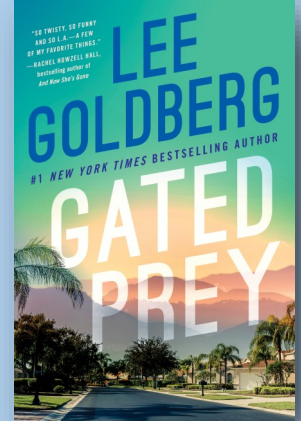

Lee Goldberg is a two-time Edgar Award winner and two-time Shamus Award nominee and the #1 New York Times bestselling author of more than thirty novels, including bestsellers *Killer Thriller* and *True Fiction*, as well as *King City*, *The Walk*, fifteen Monk mysteries, and the Fox & O'Hare books co-written with Janet Evanovich. He has also written and/or produced scores of TV shows, including *Diagnosis Murder*, *SeaQuest*, *Monk*, and *The Glades*. And he co-created the hit Hallmark movie series *Mystery 101*. As an international television consultant, he has advised networks and studios around the world on the creation, writing, and production of episodic television series.
