



Statewide Drought

- Two consecutive years of drought on heels of 2012-16 statewide drought.
- Below average snowpack, record high temperatures and runoff that did not materialize.
- Major reservoirs well below average levels.
- Groundwater basins are being overdrawn.
- Water rights being curtailed.
- Urban, agricultural and environmental uses all impacted.





Reduced Runoff and Low Reservoirs




Governor and State Actions



- April 21st Initial Declaration of Drought Emergency
- May 10th Drought Emergency expanded to 41 counties
- July 8th Drought Emergency expanded to 50 counties and call for 15% reduction in statewide water use
- October 19 Call to redouble conservation efforts and expansion of drought emergency statewide, including Los Angeles County



Regional and Local Actions




- June 15th District declared a Stage 1
 Water Shortage Alert
- July 20th District declared a Stage 2
 Water Shortage Warning and called for 15% voluntary reduction in water use
- August 17th MWD issued Water Supply Alert
- November 2nd District Board to consider additional measures including local emergency and Stage 3 Water Shortage



What Does it all Mean for us?

- Reduce outdoor water use by 25% (75% of outdoor budget).
- Eliminate water waste.
- Take advantage of available conservation rebates/incentives.





Take "Control" of your Irrigation Controller






Steps:

- 1. Find the controller.
- 2. Check days and duration.
- 3. Days x Duration = total minutes per week.
- 4. Multiple by 0.75.
- 5. Spread over two days.



Adjustment to Water Budgets



Drought Factor - 0.75 (proposed)



Mandatory Measures in Effect

- No irrigation between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- Irrigation may not occur during or 48 hours following a rain event.
- Irrigation may not result in excess runoff.
- Washing down of sidewalks and driveways is prohibited.
- Trigger nozzle is required on hoses used for home car washing.
- Hotels/motels must give multi-night guests the option not to have towels and linens replaced daily.
- Restaurants may only serve water upon request.



Enforcement

- Door hanger/Warning Letter
- Escalating fine structure (\$100, \$200 or \$500)
- For usage exceeding 150% of water budget, District may apply wasteful water use penalty (\$2.50 or \$5.00 per unit) or install flow restriction device.

- Landscape Transformation Program (\$2/ft²)
- Premium High-Efficiency Toilet (\$40)
- High-Efficiency Clothes Washer (\$85)
- Weather-Based Irrigation Controller (\$236)
- Rain Barrel (\$35)
- Rotating Sprinkler Heads (\$2/nozzle)
- Soil Moisture Sensor System (\$80)
