

Wednesday January 5, 2022



WHEREAS, Congress declared in the National Historic Preservation Act that it shall be the policy of the federal government, in partnership with the state and local governments, "to foster conditions under which our modern society and our prehistoric and historic resources can exist in productive harmony", and,

WHEREAS, the National Park Service and State of California through the Office of Historic Preservation. California State Parks, has established the Certified Local Government program to carry out this policy; and,

WHEREAS, the program recognizes local governments which have legislated a preservation program, including a qualified cultural resources commission which identifies and designates significant cultural resources to be protected for future generations and which advises the city council on actions which affect these resources; and,

WHEREAS, on July 24, 2009 the City of Calabasas has been approved by the State of California and the United States Department of the Interior to be a Certified Local Government, and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the State Historical Resources Commission and the State Historic Preservation Officer invest with the City of Calabasas all the responsibilities and benefits of certification; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to the City of Calabasas.

## Purpose:


To encourage local government participation in identification, evaluation, registration, and preservation interests and concerns.

## CLG Goals, Oct 2020 – Sept 2021

- 1. Conduct an update to the historic resource survey on the previously deemed "Eligible" properties.
- 2. Perform a condition assessment on currently listed Masson House structure and research potential grant funding in preparation for future renovations &/or repairs.
- 3. Prepare nomination documents for consideration of Warner Ranch (a.k.a., "National Velvet Barn" structure as a locally designated historic landmark.
- 4. Conduct project appropriateness reviews as necessary.

## **Progress and Constraints:**

- Conducted a site visit and updated Headwaters Corner Board on intent to update HSR for Masson House
- Received a quote on the HSR update

# Possible CLG Goals for FY Oct 2021 – Sept 2022

- 1. Present to City Council the Masson House Historic Structure Report (HSR) update proposal for funding and approval.
- 2. Initiate work on HSR provided that the City Council authorizes and funds the HSR.
- 3. Research potential grant funding in preparation for future renovations &/or repairs of the Masson House.
- 4. Review project proposals as necessary regarding potential impacts to historic resources.
- 5. Accomplish required annual training of HPC members and staff.
- 6. Continue dialogue with property owner regarding potential designation of the "National Velvet Barn".
