


Fine Free Status


Forty member libraries surveyed via SCLC Directors' listserv and Survey Monkey, with twenty three respondents.





RESPONDENTS FINE FREE

Sixteen responding SCLC library systems are fine free, and three library systems are in the process of becoming fine free.



17 systems did not respond 16 systems are fine free (3 Youth or Children only) 4 systems charge fines 3 systems are in process



Start dates

Some systems rolled out fine free status in segments, often beginning with Children or Youth first, then adding Adult in later years.

Going fine free had been a goal of ours for a couple years but I didn't think we would be able to achieve it until several years down the line. It has been nothing but positive, especially during the pandemic when people are struggling. – Burbank

Hope to expand in 2022–23. (currently Youth, only) – El Segundo and Santa Monica

It is incredibly labor intensive to collect fines. From an equity stand point it often excludes lower-income individuals from fully engaging with the library, more so than others. We still bill for unreturned items. The bill usually causes individuals to return the materials. – Glendale

ILS reminder 3 days before items due; 1 automatic renewal on due date; replacement cost is automatically billed to patron at 14 days overdue; all charges are removed when item. – Sierra Madre

I don't yet have comparative data on lost items because of the closure, but it's been a very good. – Simi Valley

It is wonderful, not having to wrangle with patrons about overdue fines! – South Pasadena

As part of the City's overall user fee study, [going fine free] was a small part of a larger undertaking. – Thousand Oaks
