




Evacuation Order Example








Evacuation Order Lifted (Repopulation Tool)








CODE SECTION 54953(e)

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2022-1779, authorizing continued remote teleconference meetings of the Calabasas City Council and City Commissions pursuant to Government Code Section 54953(e).

REPORT:

Assembly Bill 361 (AB 361) was signed by the Governor of the State of California on September 16, 2021 and went into effect until October 1, 2021, by Executive Order N-15-21. The Brown Act sets certain restrictions on public agencies holding teleconference meetings. Most notably, public officials attending a meeting virtually must post the agenda in the location they are participating from and allow members of the public to attend the meeting from that space.

AB 361 amends the Brown Act to allow "a local agency to use teleconferencing" during a proclaimed state of emergency without meeting these usual Brown Act

teleconference requirements. Under AB 361, the City may continue having meetings using teleconferencing and virtual meeting technology as long as there is a gubernatorial "proclaimed state of emergency," and either (1) state or local officials imposing or recommending measures that promote social distancing or (2) the legislative body finding that meeting in person would present an imminent safety risk to attendees.

The City Council adopted Resolution Nos. 2021-1751 on October 13, 2021, 2021-1760 on November 10, 2021, 2021-1763 on December 1, 2021, 2022-1768 on January 12, 2022, 2022-1773 on February 9, 2022, and 2022-1774 on March 23, 2022, finding that the requisite conditions exist for the Calabasas City Council Commissions to conduct teleconference meetings under California Government Code Section 54953(e).

Determinations by the City Council that the emergency affects the ability to meet safely in person must be renewed every 30 days by passing a resolution.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2022-1779, authorizing continued remote teleconference meetings of the Calabasas City Council and City Commissions pursuant to Government Code Section 54953(e).

ITEM 2 ATTACHMENT RESOLUTION NO. 2022-1779

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS, CALIFORNIA AUTHORIZING CONTINUED REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE CALABASAS CITY COUNCIL AND CITY COMMISSIONS PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953(e).

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953(e), as amended by Assembly Bill No. 361, allows legislative bodies to hold open meetings by teleconference without reference to otherwise applicable requirements in Government Code Section 54953(b)(3), so long as the legislative body complies with certain requirements, there exists a declared state of emergency, and one of the following circumstances is met:

- 1. State or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.
- 2. The legislative body is holding the meeting for the purpose of determining whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.
- The legislative body has determined that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

WHEREAS, the Calabasas City Council previously adopted Resolution Nos. 2021-1751 on October 13, 2021; 2021-1760 on November 10, 2021; 2021-1763 on December 1, 2021; 2022-1768 on January 12, 2022; 2022-1773 on February 9, 2022; and 2022-1779 on March 23, 2022, finding that the requisite conditions exist for the Calabasas City Council and Commissions to conduct teleconference meetings under California Government Code Section 54953(e); and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 54953(e)(3) requires the Calabasas City Council adopt certain findings by majority vote within 30 days of holding a meeting by teleconference under Government Code Section 54953(e), and then adopt such findings every 30 days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the Calabasas City Council desires to continue holding its public meetings by teleconference consistent with Government Code Section 54953(e).

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Conditions are Met</u>. The Calabasas City Council hereby finds and declares the following, as required by Government Code Section 54953(e)(3):

- 1. The Calabasas City Council has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to their authority under Government Code Section 8625;
- 2. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members of the Calabasas City Council to meet safely in person; and
- 3. State and local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.

The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this resolution and shall cause the same to be processed in the manner required by law.


For the past decade, I have been employed advising Los Angeles City Councilmember Paul Koretz on policy and annual City budget issues related to climate emissions reductions, wildlife protection, water conservation (particularly while he was a member of the Metropolitan Water District Board), emergency preparedness, and other environmental issues. Together, our successes have included; retiring LA's two coal-fired power plants (one demolished, one still in-progress), retiring the leaking San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, establishing the City's 100% renewable energy and carbon neutrality goals, and initiating the City's building decarbonization efforts; creation of the world's first Climate Emergency Mobilization Office, which is centered on leadership from environmental justice and labor communities and whose introduction launched a cascade of over 2,089 climate emergency declarations by municipalities worldwide; creation of LA's Biodiversity Index to count and account for the City's flora and fauna and thereby better protect them going forward; initiation of the City Council's wildlife corridors/habitat connectivity ordinance effort; hiring the City's first City Forest Officer to oversee the creation of an Urban Forest Master Plan; establishment of City's Zero Waste goals and plastic pollution regulations; updating the City's environmentally preferable purchasing programs, including instituting the Good Food Purchasing Policy which won a United Nations Future Policy Award in 2018; winning the \$1M Cool City Challenge; initiating Operation NEXT to increase the City's recycled water efforts at the Hyperion Water Reclamation Plant; and, on the MWD Board, establishing \$350 million fund for turf removal. As the City of Calabasas has recently prioritized its climate efforts and as the global climate impacts, extreme wildfires, and Southern California's megadrought continue to worsen dramatically. I believe my experience and talents could be useful to Calabasas, the city where I live and raise my children.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council receive the results from the FY 2022-23 Strategic Priorities survey and provide direction on the FY 2022-23 Workplan.

BACKGROUND:

The development of the FY 2022/23 Work Plan began in Jan 2022 with the City Council designating six Strategic Priority categories as a means of prioritizing policy areas important to the City, as well as to align specific projects and initiatives. The final Strategic Priorities selected were:

- Environmental Leadership
- Fiscal Resiliency
- Public Safety & Emergency Preparedness
- Recreation, Youth & Senior Services
- Organizational Excellence
- Development & Infrastructure

Following the selection of six Strategic Priorities, staff requested from each Councilmember a list of projects and initiatives that they would like to see accomplished during the upcoming fiscal year. Staff followed these submissions with individual meetings with each Councilmember to clarify project requests and to define specific measures of success. At the end of this process, staff were able to formulate a list composed of 87 total projects and initiatives.

The projects and initiatives list was reviewed further during a February public workshop meeting meant to substantially refine the list of 87 projects and initiatives to smaller amount that would be more manageable for staff and the public to provide input on. In the end, the City Council approved 30 projects and initiatives, 5 per Strategic Priority, that were to be given further consideration for the *draft* FY 2022-23 Work Plan.

In March, and with the projects and initiatives list now totaling 30, members of the public were invited to provide their input via an online survey. This questionnaire asked constituents to review the approved 30 projects and initiatives, and to designate no more than 18, or 3 per Strategic Priority, that they would like to see accomplished during the 2022/23 fiscal year. Participants were also able to provide comments to supplement their selections, if desired.

The results of the FY 2022/23 Strategic Priorities and Work Plan survey have been attached to this staff report.

DISCUSSION:

The final step of this year's Strategic Planning process is the adoption of the FY 2022/23 Work Plan, which is composed of the following project/initiative components:

- Staff action items to accomplish the project/initiative
- Target date to complete action items
- Fiscal impact of carrying out action items
- Responsible departments
- Comments related to the action items, or the project in general

The purpose of the Work Plan is to outline the implementation of approved projects/initiatives through staff action items during a specific time frame. This provides the benefit of properly allocating City resources and staff time, while also measuring project performance and staff deliverables.

To ensure that the City Council and public are apprised of the status of projects/initiatives, staff will track and report Work Plan progress reports at least every four months, or sooner if the need arises. These updates will also provide the

opportunity the City Council to make amendments to the Work Plan or provide alternative direction to staff.

The draft FY 2022/23 Work Plan is attached to this staff report.
