## **Strategic Priorities Survey**

### **Survey Overview**

City conducted an online survey to acquire public input on the 29 projects and initiatives approved by City Council

Active for 17 days

Respondents were asked to designate their top 3 projects or initiatives within each Strategic Priority category – 18 total

Comments could also be provided, if desired

### Response Highlights


310 surveys completed

59% over 55 years old - - - 39% aged 19-54 - - - 2% under 18

98% residents of Calabasas

39 responses from Commission and Advisory Board members, with at least one member from each Commission participating.



City Council will be asked to designate no more than 12 projects total for the final Work Plan








