






Statewide Drought

- Third consecutive year of drought on heels of 2012-16 statewide drought.
- Driest 3-month stretch between January to March since record keeping began.
- Below average snowpack, record high temperatures and runoff that did not materialize.
- Major reservoirs well below average levels.
- Urban, agricultural and environmental uses all impacted.











Seasonal Temperature Outlook





Regional and Local Actions




- June 15th District declared a Stage 1
 Water Shortage Alert.
- July 20th District declared a Stage 2
 Water Shortage Warning and called for 15% voluntary reduction in water use.
- August 17th MWD issued Water Supply Alert.
- November 2nd District Board adopted additional measures including local drought emergency and Stage 3 Water Shortage.
- April 5th 2022 Board reduces outdoor water budgets to 50%.




What Does It All Mean for Us?

- Reduce outdoor water use by 50% (of outdoor budget).
- Eliminate water waste.
- Take advantage of available conservation rebates/incentives.





Take "Control" of your Irrigation Controller





Steps:

- 1. Find the controller.
- 2. Check days and duration.
- 3. Days x Duration = total minutes per week.
- 4. Multiple by 0.50.
- 5. Spread over two days.



Mandatory Measures in Effect

No irrigation between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Irrigation may not occur during or 48 hours following a rain event.

Irrigation may not result in excess runoff.

Washing down of sidewalks and driveways is prohibited.

Trigger nozzle is required on hoses used for home car washing.


Hotels/motels must give multi-night guests the option not to have towels and linens replaced daily.

Restaurants may only serve water upon request.



Enforcement

- Door hanger/Warning Letter.
- Escalating fine structure (\$100, \$200 or \$500).
- For usage exceeding 150% of water budget, District may apply wasteful water use penalties and possibly install a flow restriction device.





Enforcement of Outdoor Water Budget Exceedance

- 1st penalty: A warning will be provided along with an estimate of what the penalty amount would have been.
- 2nd penalty: An extra charge of \$2.50 per unit of water (748 gallons) over 150% of water budget.
- 3rd penalty: An extra charge of \$5.00 per unit of water over 150% of budget. Customers that receive a 3rd or subsequent penalties are also subject to the **installation of a flow restriction device**.
- 4th penalty: An extra charge of \$7.50 per unit of water over 150% of budget.
- 5th and subsequent penalties: An extra charge of \$10.00 per unit of water over 150% of budget.



Exceptions

- Drip Irrigation Systems
- Hand Watering bucket, watering can, hose with auto shutoff nozzle
- Trees vary depending on the species, size and maturity of the tree – but generally we would recommend watering trees by hand up to twice a week – and a bit deeper watering to reach the root zone of the tree.



HOA Compliance

- An HOA cannot issue a fine or assessment on a homeowner for reducing or eliminating the watering of vegetation or lawns during a state or locally-declared drought emergency (Civil Code section 4735(c)).
- An HOA cannot enforce architectural or landscaping guidelines or policies that prohibit, or have the effect of prohibiting, compliance with most local water-efficient landscape ordinances.
- An HOA cannot require that a homeowner pressure wash the exterior of their home, vehicles and concrete surfaces during a declared state of drought emergency (Civil Code section 4736(b)).



Bottom Line

- We are in a locally-declared water emergency.
- LVMWD customers are 100% dependent on imported water for drinking (State Water Project (SWP) Dependent Area).
- Water conservation targets are falling short.
- District is increasing enforcement of outdoor watering restrictions (50% of outdoor budget) with continued penalties and monitoring via "drive arounds."
- MWD considering a one day a week watering restriction beginning June 1,
 2022 Just held meeting on Tuesday April 26, 2022.
- Odd address one day, even another 8 minutes per station (proposed)
- Current watering restrictions are unprecedented and could lead to a complete ban on outdoor watering this year.
- This drought could continue into next year.
