

# Background

- Masson House 23075 Mulholland Hwy
- Designated Calabasas Historic Landmark #1
- 2010 Original Historic Structure Report (HSR) was prepared by Historic Resources Group, LLC
- The 2010 HSR indicated approximately \$342,619 necessary for identified repairs
- The 2010 HSR is twelve years old and must be updated







# Historic Structures Report

#### Purpose:

- 1. Fully and accurately document existing conditions
- 2. Identify needed repairs and rehabilitation work for:
  - Features and components of the exterior, as necessary and appropriate to retain the historic appearance;
  - Foundation and structural components (non-contributing elements), as necessary to meet applicable building codes;
  - Plumbing, HVAC, and electrical systems (non-contributing elements), as necessary to meet applicable building codes.
- 3. Prepare a cost estimate for all identified repair and rehabilitation work



## Issues Identified (Preliminary, from the 2010 HSR)



- Portion of house has no foundation, and other portions of the foundation require strengthening
- Oak tree stumps supporting floor (must be removed and replaced for structural integrity and safety)
- Drainage problems and associated rot
- Chimney needs to be reinforced
- Termites in rafters and likely in other locations as well
- Wood floor is structurally unsound



### **Adaptive Reuse of the Masson House**

<u>Adaptive Reuse</u> – Repurposing a building for a new use while preserving its architectural and cultural heritage.

#### Potential Uses:


- Multi-function gathering space with passive walk-through exhibit on walls and general periphery. Space would be open by appointment only to groups, such as Scouts, schools, clubs, educational tours, etc.
- Office space for Headwaters Corner
- On-site residence for Headwaters
   Corner property manager (as an affordable housing unit)
