City Plan Updates

The city will be updating the EOP (Emergency Operations Plan) and also a COOP (Continuity of Operations Plan). The HMP (Hazard Mitigation Plan) was revised in 2018, and is due in 2023. The COG (Council of Governments) is working on obtaining a grant for the next update.

City EOC Training

The city has been training its employees on the basic concepts of an EOC (Emergency Operations Center) which also included general and section specific information. A tabletop exercise was conducted which included Sheriff, Fire and CHP. An AAR (After Action Report) will be discussed/reviewed in the near future. Specified employees are taking intermediate Management, Logistics, Operations, Planning and PIO training. The plan is to have tabletop exercises and possibly a functional exercise. A functional exercise includes the residents, Law and Fire, and will include test messaging to the public.

Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy Grant – We are still waiting for the parts for the mobile EOC trailer. The upgrade to the backup repeater system with solar power has been completed.

Crime Prevention – Chair Boucher and Vice Chair Slatoff will form the crime prevention subcommittee.

CRC (Community Resource Center) – This is a location that the community can use during a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) and charge their phones or laptops or keep medication cool in the refrigerator. We are working on a second agreement for the Calabasas Tennis and Swim Center.

CERT (Community Emergency Response Training) – We have completed 3 sessions with 30 participants the first night, and 20 the second night. About half of the class are residents of Calabasas.

NOAA Radios - These weather radios will be distributed by the Fire Department on August 18. We have designated Council, PSC, CERP and EPIC to receive them, as well as others from the community. At this time we only have a limited number of radios.

JULY 4TH SPECTACULAR – Brian Cameron assisted in the First Aid booth at the 4th of July event. He also represented EPIC. And he did a great job!

CPR Training – the city is offering a CPR and First Aid class on Monday, August 15, 8:00 am – 2:30 pm to volunteers of the city. Please send me an email if you are interested in attending.
