Chair Mia Spiegel called the meeting to order at 6:06 p.m. via Zoom Teleconferencing.

OPENING MATTERS

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mia Spiegel.

ORAL COMMUNICATION - PUBLIC COMMENT

No one spoke during public comment.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

1. Mayor Maurer provided an update regarding the drought and the new restrictions on outdoor watering. She explained about the water recycling process as well as the change in landscape Calabasas will experience in order for more drought tolerant, fire resistant land. Mayor Maurer also announced the new eateries opening in the City soon: Cafecito and Crossroads.

Councilmember Bozajian provided an update regarding the California Primary Election on June 7, 2022; and that there will be a runoff between Bob Hertzberg and Lindsey Horvath for the Board of Supervisors seat. In addition, he announced that there will be a runoff between Alex Villanueva and Robert Luna for Los Angeles County Sheriff. He additionally spoke about organizing a Young Voter Night in September.

Mayor Maurer mentioned how there will possibly be a change in format of the Mayor's Youth Council's meetings.

4. Discussion of 2021-2022 MYC remaining budget

Ms. Hernandez reported that the amount remaining in the budget for this fiscal year is \$4,958.04. Mayor Maurer suggested that the MYC use money to purchase giveaways during voter registration drives. In addition, it was suggested to hold a MYC logo contest and purchase giveaways for the winners.

- 5. Reports from subcommittee leaders and discussion of upcoming events
 - Civic Engagement: Chloe Elie suggested having voter registration drives at summer concerts. The MYC Voter registration drive competition will be on September 20 (National Voter Registration Day) between Calabasas and Viewpoint. There will be certain changes to the competition to ensure each school has a fair advantage.
 - Communications: Siena Goldfarb mentioned that Jordan Matalon continues to work with Instagram regarding an MYC ad. The subcommittee will post and advertise any other events.
 - Cultural Awareness & Diversity: Mia Spiegel reported a display of books will be available in the Calabasas Library for Juneteenth in addition to books reflecting the importance of Pride month.

- Environment: Niccolo Terango reported that he would like to have an in-person screening of the documentary *Gasland*. The exact date will be worked out and provided at a later date.
- Wellness: Nicole Mazaheri reported on the success of the NAMI event that took place in May. The subcommittee is planning on looking into organizing clothing donation drives in the months to come.

3. Group discussion about best practices for conducting subcommittee meetings:

Councilmember Bozajian encouraged subcommittees to hold regular meetings in order to increase the progress of activities. Ms. Hernandez asked the Mayor's Youth Council for ideas on more frequent meetings and reporting for events.

Nicole Mazaheri suggested subcommittees meet after the monthly Mayor's Youth Council meetings. Chloe Elie and Niccolo Terrango agreed that it would be more efficient that subcommittees meet after the regular meetings.

4. Group discussion about the following upcoming events:

 National Mindfulness Day - Sep 12
 Nicole Mazaheri mentioned that the Wellness subcommittee will plan a clothing drive during the week of Mindfulness Day.

National Voter Registration Day - Sep 20 Councilmember Bozajian suggested having another Young Voter Night, and working on attracting more students. The date, September 20, will be confirmed, and the Civic Engagement Committee will start working on the event. Mia Spiegel mentioned that there could be a competition between Calabasas High School and Viewpoint for how many students attend the event.

Indigenous People's Day - Oct 12 Mia Spiegel announced that her subcommittee will work on another display at the Library with books written by authors who are part of the Indigenous community and books about history on the Indigenous community. Also, she spoke about the Red Hawk Native American Arts Council, which offers online or in-person programs and workshops.

Pumpkin Festival - Oct 16

Riley Grayson suggested having a voter registration booth at the festival. Councilmember Bozajian suggested that the booth offer information about the Climate Action Plan with an environmental theme. Water bottle flasks can be purchased with the MYC logo to promote reusing bottles and conservation.

• MYC logo contest

The draft flyer for the logo contest was sent out to members of the Mayor's Youth Council. The flyer will be posted on the MYC Instagram page, and the deadline to send in the logos will be finalized. Contest participants will include high school and middle school students.

5. Reports from subcommittee leaders and discussion of upcoming events

Civic Engagement:

Chloe Elie explained that there will be a voter registration drive at the last summer concert on August 28. She also reported that a voter registration

drive was held one July 19. The Civic Engagement subcommittee will also start planning for National Voter Registration Day.

Communications:

Riley Grayson reported that the subcommittee is working on getting the photos from the July 19 summer concert from the Calabasas Style Magazine photographer to share on Instagram. The subcommittee will also post flyers and general information for upcoming MYC events.

Cultural Awareness & Diversity: Mia Spiegel reported the events being planned at the library for Indigenous Peoples Day.

Environment:

Niccolo Terango reported that the subcommittee is waiting on a decision on whether to proceed with the Gasland Documentary screening.


Wellness:

The Mayor's Youth Council adjourned to the next regular meeting on Monday, September 12, 2022.


