## II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A robbery was reported in the 4700 block of Commons Way. The suspects, two females in their 30's, entered the location and began to place store items into a gray plastic bag. They began to exit without paying for the items and an employee attempted to stop one of the suspects. That suspect slapped the victim's arm and fled with the stolen property and the other suspect in a gray Infinity SUV. (22-04579)

A Canoga Park resident was arrested for battery on a peace officer in the area of Park Granada and Parkway Calabasas. The suspect pushed the victim (deputy) and the victim received a dislocated shoulder. (22-04465)

A residential burglary occurred in the 24700 block of Avenida Asoleda. The victim received a motion alert from the Ring surveillance system. It showed three males wearing all black clothing with gloves in the victim's backyard. One suspect had a crowbar and another had a gray backpack. One of the suspects took down the Ring surveillance camera above the rear sliding door. The rear sliding glass door was shattered to gain entry. The victim was in the process of moving and the house was mostly empty. The upstairs master bedroom closet was ransacked. The suspects only stole a shoe which was recovered at the golf course behind the residence. (22-04840)

Two commercial burglaries were reported in the 26500 block of Agoura Road. The front glass doors to the businesses were shattered to gain entry and the safe in each location was stolen by unknown suspect(s). Four similar incidents occurred during the same date and times frames in the city of Agoura Hills and one similar incident also occurred in the city of Westlake Village. (22-04297, 04298)

A Tarzana resident was arrested for theft of a vehicle which occurred in the 4700 block of Park Granada. The suspect stole the vehicle key from the victim during an argument. The vehicle was recovered in the 4700 block of Commons Way. (22-04619)

ACTIVITY REPORT FOR AUGUST 2022  
CALABASAS**

**A. SCHOOL ISSUES**

LVUSD First day of school on 08/24/2022. Extra patrol around schools regarding pick up/drop off traffic congestions. Assisted Calabasas High School re: students involved in inappropriate behavior on school grounds. Chaparral Elementary School re: upset neighbors over school pick up/ drop off traffic congestion.

**B. INTERVENTIONS**

Counseled parents and juveniles re: discipline/behavioral concerns with school for prior school semester.  
Contacted concerned parent re: discipline toward child due to inappropriate behavior in school.

**C. COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
2. We inquired with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
4. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month to keep her up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
5. Entered juveniles into the Juvenile Automated Index system for various violations.
6. We investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
7. Met with station narcotic detectives to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug related issues.
8. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel.
9. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile related calls for service.
10. Training at Wayside for EVOC, Lost Hills Station for PIO training, LASD CHAMP Training regarding Juvenile Diversion Referrals.
11. Registered 3 sexual predators and updated information in database.
12. Month End Reports completed.
13. Assisted Records Sealing Unit with several cases.
14. Assisted Patrol re: CARP, backfill behind patrol/shortage, mandatory overtime.
