OPENING MATTERS

Call to Order/Roll Call of Commissioners

Chair Boucher called the meeting to order at 6:06 p.m.

3. Sheriff's Department Report

5. Fire Department Report

Assistant Chief Smith reviewed the Fire Department reports from April – June 2022. They have a robust 365-day wildfire response. Pleased that home hardening assessments are being conducted. With water restrictions in place you need to maintain vegetation, *remove dead vegetation 0 – 5 feet from your house.* Create defensible space by removing stressed or dead foliage. Commissioner Citron stated that you can call LVMWD for additional allotments for stressed trees.
