II. <u>NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS</u>

A residential burglary occurred in the 22500 block of Calipatria Drive. A rear window was smashed to gain entry and ransacked the residence. LASD Century Station deputies arrested a subject from Adelanto with the stolen checks from this burglary. The investigation is on-going. (22-05877)

A commercial burglary was reported in the 25700 block of Calabasas Road. The front window was smashed to gain entry. Video footage showed two unknown males wearing black gloves and masks. No property was stolen. (22-05674)

In the incident that occurred on Rondell Street, the suspects were described as four males in a black Ford pickup truck with a bicycle rack. In the incident that occurred on Garrett Drive, the suspects were described as four males, no further description. The incident in the 26500 block of Agoura Road, one suspect was described as a male wearing an orange construction type shirt. The other two suspects were waiting in a black Infiniti QX50 SUV. A resident from Rosemead was arrested for theft in the 26500 block of Agoura Road. The suspect entered the location, selected store items, and exited without paying for the items. The suspect was also additionally charged with violation of probation. (22-05774)

A Calabasas resident was arrested for arson in the 5000 block of Ludgate Drive. The suspect (victim's son) set fire to the victim's mail, patio furniture and umbrella. (22-05778)
