II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A Canoga Park resident was arrested for assault in the 4700 block of Commons Way. The victim, a security guard at the location, told the suspect that begging in front of the location was not allowed and escorted the suspect off the property. The suspect then assaulted the victim with his hands and threatened the victim with a switch blade. (22-06666)

Two residential burglaries were reported in the 4300 block of Park Blu during the same date and time frames. The homes are next to each other and entry into the homes were through a smashed rear sliding glass door. The master bedrooms and closets were ransacked. Video footage showed two males wearing dark clothing, masks and gloves. (22-06920, 06921)

Three incidents of theft of catalytic converters were reported this month. The incidents occurred in the 4000 block of Las Virgenes Road, 5400 block of Ruthwood Drive and the 23500 block of Calabasas Road. Vehicles targeted were a 1999 Ford F250 pickup (attempt), two 2016 Collins school buses, and two 2016 Ford 2500 buses. In one incident, the victim heard a noise coming from the front of the residence and went outside. The victim saw two males, approximately 20 years old, attempting to steal the catalytic converter from his vehicle. The suspects fled in a gray SUV. (22-06644, 06794, 06908)

Two incidents involving the theft of wallets occurred at the same business in the 23700 block of Calabasas Road. The victims left their purses on the shopping cart and when they went to pay, they noticed their wallets stolen. In one incident, the victim's stolen credit card was used at Neiman Marcus. A similar incident was reported at another business in the 4700 block of Commons Way. (22-06651, 06738, 06951)

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES
