Some people have placards for an unlimited time, due to chronic health conditions. Some of these limitations are easily noticeable, but sometimes the person looks healthy but has a medical issue that can't be seen at first glance.

“Parking Envy Parking Rage” is the title of an article that cites the excuses or explanations people attending a football game used when they were caught violating handicapped parking spaces. One man said about the handicapped placard, “It’s my wife’s and she’s joining me later.” Another excuse, “It belongs to my dad and me.” And lastly, one man said “The placard belongs to my grandmother and I’m a long-time season ticket holder and am angry because I couldn’t get preferred parking.”

Our beautiful senior center doesn’t compare to a huge football stadium, but like the stadium, it hasn’t gone unnoticed that some able-bodied people are parking in designated handicapped spaces. It’s been brought to our attention.

What can we do? If you have something heavy to bring into the center, please ask the staff for assistance. If you had a temporary placard following a medical procedure or surgery and are now recovered, please park in the other spaces. Most of all, be considerate and mindful of others who really need the space near the front door to attend a class or program. Put yourself in the other person’s place and be courteous. It’s never too late to follow the “Golden Rule”

What's This?

There are not many people in town who remember the founding of Calabasas Park 55 years ago — which, back then, mostly referred to the area we now call Classic Calabasas Park.

Calabasas Park formally opened to the public on May 12, 1968, developed by subsidiaries of the Southern California Edison Company and the Bechtel Corporation. To kindle interest in the new residential community, the developers ran a series of unusual advertisements in several magazines from 1967 to 1971. Each of these ads had a common theme: A human hand interacting with various inanimate objects within a miniature model of Calabasas Park.

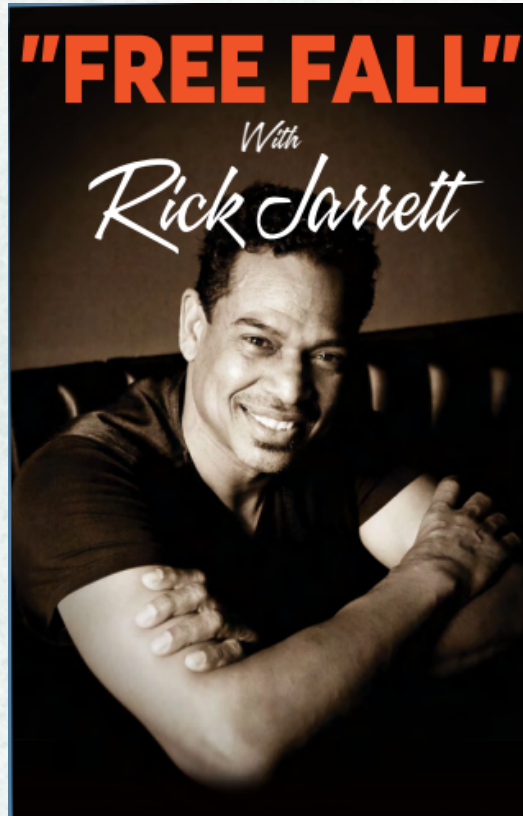
Of all the ads, this one (Life Magazine; June 7, 1968) is probably my favorite. The setting of this recognizable image is Parkway Calabasas, looking south from Calabasas Road. As you can observe, many features of the developer's original vision for Calabasas Park remain largely intact today.

The descriptions within these vintage ads hearken to a nostalgic era in our local history. Calabasas Park is boldly described as “the most luxurious new community that has been built in Southern California in forty years,” located in “one of the few remaining untouched areas of Southern California,” with a prediction that “our homes will be some of the most beautiful ever built in Southern California.” Other specific elements of Calabasas Park are mentioned as follows:

- Estate homes starting at \$55,000, lakefront homes starting at \$45,000 (— alas, if my parents had only known!).
- A series of secluded valleys, wooded hills, lakes, streams, canyons, and trails.
- A 21-acre, filtered lake for swimming, boating, and fishing. [Calabasas Lake]
- A recreation club featuring tennis courts, a swimming pool, a gym, and other amenities. [the Calabasas Park Tennis Club, now the Calabasas Tennis & Swim Center]
- A gun club with trap and skeet ranges. [the Calabasas Gun Club, once located within what would later become The Oaks of Calabasas]
- A riding club. [the Calabasas Riding Club, no longer in existence]
- A golf course. [the Calabasas Country Club]
- A restaurant overlooking Calabasas Lake. [The Californian Restaurant, later replaced by The Calabasas Inn, and now the site of The Avanti]
- All-electric homes.

We do not know what became of the model used for this advertisement (though we would love to have it within our warehouse of historical artifacts). At one time the Calabasas Historical Society actually had photos of the grand opening of Calabasas Park, highlighted by the special appearance of then-Governor Ronald Reagan.

Unfortunately, those photos, along with other precious items, were stolen from the Historical Society's inventory a while ago. These delightful advertisements have now been preserved digitally by the City of Calabasas, and they will soon be available to view as part of the collection maintained by the Calabasas Municipal Library.
