Mayor David Shapiro administered the Oath of Office to Zoe Kramar and welcomed her to the MYC.

PRESENTATIONS

3. By LA County Sheriff's Department Sergeant Armstrong regarding the Explorer Program

Sergeant Armstrong made a presentation to the MYC and encouraged members to join the Explorer Program.

4. By City of Calabasas Community Development Director, Michael Klein

Mr. Klein made a presentation to the MYC and provided an overview regarding the different processes for housing and buildings within the City. He reported on future plans such as another car dealership on Calabasas Road and a mixed-use complex in the parking lot next to City Hall. Furthermore, he reported on new businesses coming into the City such as Crumble Cookies, Phil's Coffee, La La Kind Cafe, Cadillac, Hanks Bagels and others. Mr. Klein also reported that the old Subway would be replaced by a Sushi restaurant.

Members of the Economic Development subcommittee discussed how the MYC can help promote new businesses moving into City locations such as the Commons.

Civic Engagement:

Ryan Trachuk reported that his subcommittee would be conducting voter registration during Earth Day. He mentioned the subcommittee would like to start a speaker series. Avery Shellow mentioned there is a possibility of teaming up with La La Land Café to conduct voter registration. Jordan Matalon reported that he and other members met with La La Land owner, Francois, who gave the group a tour and is open to the possibility of working together. Delany Grayson suggested creating a discount card to support local businesses.

Communications:

Lauren Avedis mentioned that La La Land Café is gaining popularity through social media. Jordan Matalon suggested the possibility of creating a video to promote new businesses. Ethan Perlmutter mentioned the use of high school social media such as Calabasas High School's KYOTV and Calabasas Courier.

Cultural Awareness & Diversity:

Anthony Sherman stated that his subcommittee discussed funding to ship donated goods to Ukraine through the use of donations or fundraisers. Furthermore, he mentioned holding the donation drive at the local high schools and City Hall. Moreover, he suggested bringing discussions on important topics to the community. Daniel Perlmutter mentioned utilizing school programs such as NHS to help boost the donation drive at the school. Avery Shellow agreed with Daniel's idea and stated that the Calabasas Rotary could also assist with the donation drive.

Economic Development:

Noah Weintraub also reported on the meeting with the La La Land Café's owner and how the MYC could possibly help promote La La Land Café and other businesses in the City. Mayor pro Tem Weintraub suggested using the discount app Caruso Signature at the Commons.

Environment:

Since Navin Parmar had to leave early, Bella Raichelson reported their subcommittee has been working on Earth Day event. Furthermore, it was emphasized the importance that all members participate during Earth Day and other MYC events.

Wellness:

Siena Goldfarb reported on the upcoming Fentanyl event with the J-Team and Sheila Scott who will present on fentanyl effects and how to administer Narcan. The event will be held at 6 pm on May 23 in Founder's Hall. She further reported that they will be reaching out to schools, particularly A.C. Stelle and A.E. Wright.

Jordan Matalon reinforced the importance to participate at Earth Day and recapped on the Ukraine donation drive the Cultural Awareness & Diversity subcommittee will hold on April 29.
