

**PLANNING COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2023-756**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS TO APPROVE FILE NO. SPR-2022-012, A REQUEST FOR A SITE PLAN REVIEW TO DEMOLISH AN EXISTING 2,569 SQUARE-FOOT RESIDENCE AND TO CONSTRUCT A NEW 4,305 SQUARE-FOOT SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENCE AND ASSOCIATED NEW GARAGE, LANDSCAPING, HARDSCAPE, SWIMMING POOL, AND RETAINING WALLS, LOCATED AT 4022 BON HOMME RD (APN: 2079-016-018) WITHIN THE RESIDENTIAL SINGLE-FAMILY (RS) ZONING DISTRICT.**

**Section 1. The Planning Commission has considered all of the evidence submitted into the administrative record which includes, but is not limited to:**

1. Agenda reports prepared by the Community Development Department.
2. Staff presentation at the public hearing held on July 20, 2023, before the Planning Commission.
3. The City of Calabasas Land Use and Development Code, General Plan, and all other applicable regulations and codes.
4. Public comments, both written and oral, received and/or submitted at or prior to the public hearing, supporting and/or opposing the applicant's request.
5. Testimony and/or comments from the applicant and its representatives submitted to the City in both written and oral form at or prior to the public hearing.
6. All related documents received and/or submitted at or prior to the public hearing.

**Section 2. Based on the foregoing evidence, the Planning Commission finds that:**

1. On November 15, 2022 an application was submitted on behalf of the property owner for File No. SPR-2022-012.
2. The project was reviewed by the Development Review Committee (DRC) on December 1, 2022, and by the City's Architectural Review Panel (ARP) on May 26, 2023.
3. Staff determined that the application was incomplete on December 14, 2022 and the applicant was duly notified of this incomplete status.
4. Plans were revised and resubmitted by the applicant on May 1, 2023.
5. Following subsequent resubmittals, the application and plans were deemed complete by Staff on July 6, 2023.
6. Notice of the July 20, 2023 Planning Commission public hearing was posted at Juan de Anza Park, the Calabasas Tennis and Swim Center, and at Calabasas City Hall.
7. Notice of the July 20, 2023 Planning Commission public hearing was provided to property owners within 500 feet of the property as shown on the latest equalized assessment roll.
8. Notice of the July 20, 2023 Planning Commission public hearing was mailed or delivered at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing to the project applicant.
9. Notice of the July 20, 2023 Planning Commission public hearing included the notice requirements set forth in Government Code Section 65009 (b)(2).
10. A public hearing was held at the July 20, 2023 Planning Commission meeting, during which public testimony was taken.
11. At the July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023 meeting, the Commissioners recommended that Staff prepare a resolution of approval for File No. SPR-2022-012, to be brought back to the Commission for approval at the next regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting.
12. The project site is zoned Residential Single-Family (RS).
13. The land use designation for the project site under the City's adopted General Plan is Residential-Single Family (R-SF).

14. Properties surrounding the project site are zoned RS, and have General Plan land use designations of R-SF and Public Facilities- Institutional (PF-I).

**Section 3. In view of all of the evidence and based on the foregoing findings, the Planning Commission finds as follows:**

### **FINDINGS**

Section 17.62.020 of the Calabasas Municipal Code (CMC) allows the Planning Commission to approve a **Site Plan Review Permit** provided that the following findings are made:

1. *The proposed project complies with all applicable provisions of this Development Code;*

The subject site is improved with an existing 2,569 square-foot single-family residence, driveway, landscape, hardscape, and pool. The applicant is proposing to demolish the existing residence and site features, and construct a new 4,305 square-foot single-family residence with associated landscape, hardscape, and pool. The proposed single-family residence and associated features are allowed uses within the Residential Single-Family zoning district per Section 17.11.010 of the Calabasas Municipal Code (CMC). The proposed residence complies with all development code standards in regard to height, setbacks, site coverage, pervious surfaces, and other requirements (see the Technical Appendix within the Planning Commission Agenda Report). Therefore, the project complies with all applicable provisions of the Development Code, and meets this finding.

2. *The proposed project is consistent with the general plan, any applicable specific plan, and any special design theme adopted by the city for the site and vicinity;*

The existing use of the subject site is a two-story single-family residence with attendant landscaping, hardscape, and pool, which are allowed uses per the R-SF land use designation within the General Plan. The construction of a new two-story single-family residence with associated landscaping, hardscape, and pool will not change the land use of the subject site, nor will the proposed work disturb natural features and habitat areas to a degree that is inconsistent with other General Plan policies.

Chapter IX of the General Plan, more specifically policies IX-1, IX-5, IX-8 and IX-10 emphasize that new development shall maintain a high-quality appearance, and is aesthetically pleasing and compatible with the area's natural setting. The Architectural Review Panel recommended approval of the project, with suggestions regarding extending the roof eaves along the sides of the residence which the applicant has since revised the plans to incorporate. Therefore, the proposed project is consistent with the General Plan and meets this finding.

3. *The approval of the site plan review is in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA);*

This project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines adopted by the City of Calabasas pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3)(General Rule Exemption) and categorically exempt pursuant to Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) and Section 15303 (New Construction), because the project is limited to demolition and reconstruction of one single-family residence. Therefore, the proposed project is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act, and the proposed project meets this finding.

4. *The proposed structures, signs, site development, grading and/or landscaping are compatible in design, appearance and scale, with existing uses, development, signs, structures and landscaping for the surrounding area;*

The subject site is zoned Residential Single-Family (RS), and is surrounded by other one and two-story single-family residences. The proposed project includes demolition of the existing 2,569 square-foot residence. The total square footage of the proposed new residence will be 4,305 square feet. Residences within the surrounding area range in size from 1,741 square feet to 4,042 square feet (see the Technical Appendix within the Planning Commission Agenda Report). The proposed second floor is stepped back from the first floor, and architectural elements are proposed at the front façade to break up the massing of the residence when viewed from the street. Additionally, the proposed colors & materials palette, which includes an off-white stucco and stone siding at the first floor façade, is designed to help integrate the residence into the surrounding neighborhood.

The proposed project was reviewed by the City's Architectural Review Panel (ARP) on May 26, 2023, in accordance with Section 2.40.040 of the CMC. The ARP recommended approval of the project and made

suggestions regarding revising the eaves to wrap around the sides of the residence to eliminate appearance of blank walls, which the applicant has since revised the plans to incorporate.

Based on the above information, the Planning Commission finds that the proposed project is compatible in use, design, appearance, and scale with the existing homes in the surrounding area and meets this finding.

5. *The site is adequate in size and shape to accommodate the proposed structures, yards, walls, fences, parking, landscaping, and other development features;*

The City's Land Use and Development Code contains development standards for setbacks, height limits, site coverage, and pervious surface for the RS zone to ensure that development is adequately proportional to the size of the property. The proposed project includes demolition of the existing residence and construction of a new 4,305 square-foot residence. The project does not involve any alteration to the existing undeveloped sloped area at the rear of the lot, and does not expand the graded pad beyond the existing condition at the subject site. Additionally, the proposed new residence complies with all required development standards for the RS zoning district. Therefore, the proposed project meets this finding.

6. *The proposed project is designed to respect and integrate with the existing surrounding natural environment to the maximum extent feasible.*

The proposed project is designed to respect and integrate with the existing surrounding natural environment to the maximum extent feasible because the proposed project is located on an existing developed lot, surrounded by other one and two-story single-family residences. The proposed project includes demolition of the existing residence and associated site features, and reconstruction of a new residence and associated hardscape, landscape, and pool. The applicant has submitted a landscape plan with detail on what specific new plantings are being proposed to better integrate the project with the surrounding natural environment. Additionally, no grading or site work is proposed on the undeveloped sloped area at the rear of the subject site. Lastly, the ARP determined that the design of the proposed project is compatible with its surroundings, and recommended approval to the Planning Commission with suggestions that have since been incorporated into the project plans. Therefore, the proposed project meets this finding.

**Section 4. In view of all of the evidence and based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, the Planning Commission approves File No. SPR-2022-012 subject to the following agreement and conditions:**

## **I. INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT**

The City has determined that City, its employees, agents and officials should, to the fullest extent permitted by law, be fully protected from any loss, injury, damage, claim, lawsuit, expense, attorney fees, litigation expenses, court costs or any other costs arising out of or in any way related to the issuance of File No. SPR-2022-012, or the activities conducted pursuant to this File No. SPR-2022-012. Accordingly, to the fullest extent permitted by law, the applicant and property owner, and their successor and assigns, shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its employees, agents and officials, from and against any liability, claims, suits, actions, arbitration proceedings, regulatory proceedings, losses, expenses or costs of any kind, whether actual, alleged or threatened, including, but not limited to, actual attorney fees, litigation expenses and court costs of any kind without restriction or limitation, incurred in relation to, as a consequence of, arising out of or in any way attributable to, actually, allegedly or impliedly, in whole or in part, the issuance of File No. SPR-2022-012, or the activities conducted pursuant to File No. SPR-2022-012. The applicant and property owner, and their successor and assigns, shall pay such obligations as they are incurred by City, its employees, agents and officials, and in the event of any claim or lawsuit, shall submit a deposit in such amount as the City reasonably determines necessary to protect the City from exposure to fees, costs or liability with respect to such claim or lawsuit.

## **II. CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

### **Community Development Department/Planning/Building and Safety**

1. The proposed project shall be built in compliance with the approved plans on file with the Planning Division.
2. All project conditions and the interim maintenance plan shall be imprinted on the title sheet of the construction drawings. The approved set of plans shall be retained on-site for the review of Building Inspectors. Prior to any use of the project site, all conditions of approval shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Director of Community Development.

3. The project approved herein is depicted on those sets of drawings, elevations, etc., stamped approved by staff on the approval date. Any modifications to these plans must be approved by the Department of Community Development staff prior to the changes on the working drawings or in the field. Changes considered substantial by the Planning staff must be reviewed by the Planning Commission. The determination of whether or not a change is substantial shall be made by the Director of Community Development.
4. Prior to issuance of grading or building permits, plans shall be reviewed and approved by the Department of Community Development to ensure compliance with the plans approved by the Planning Commission. The plans shall comply with the conditions contained herein, the Calabasas Municipal Code, and all City Resolutions and Ordinances.
5. The subject property shall be developed, maintained, and operated in full compliance with the conditions of this grant and any law, statute, ordinance or other regulation applicable to any development or activity on the subject property. Failure of the applicant or its successors to cease any development or activity not in full compliance shall be a violation of these conditions. Any violation of the conditions of approval may result in the revocation of this approval.
6. This grant shall not be effective for any purposes until after the applicant, or its successors, and the owner of the property involved (if other than the applicant) have recorded an affidavit of acceptance of this resolution with the Los Angeles County Recorder's Office, and a certified copy of the recorded document is filed with the Community Development Department.
7. This approval shall be valid for one year and eleven days from the date of adoption of the resolution. The permit may be extended in accordance with Title 17 Land Use and Development Code, Article VI - Land Use and Development Permits.
8. All ground and roof-mounted equipment is required to be fully screened from view. Upon final inspection, Planning Division staff may require additional screening if warranted, through either landscaping, walls or a combination thereof.
9. All exterior lights are subject to the provisions set forth in the Lighting Ordinance Chapter 17.20 of the Land Use and Development Code.

10. Prior to commencement of construction, all necessary building permits must be obtained from the Building and Safety Division.
11. The project must comply with the building codes of Title 15.04 of the CMC at the time of building plan check submittal.
12. The project is located within a designated Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. The requirements of Chapter 15.04.900 of the CMC shall be incorporated into all plans.
13. The applicant shall provide the construction contractor(s) and each subcontractor related to the project a copy of the final project Conditions of Approval. The applicant and the City agree that these conditions shall be enforceable through all legal and equitable remedies, including the imposition of fines against each and every person who conducts any activity on behalf of the applicant on or near the project site. The applicant, property owner, and general construction contractor are ultimately responsible for all actions or omissions of a subcontractor.
14. Construction Activities - Hours of construction activity shall be limited to:
  - 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday
  - 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Saturday

Stacking of construction worker vehicles, prior to 7:00 a.m. in the morning will be restricted to areas that do not adversely affect adjacent residences or schools. No vehicles involved in construction of this project shall block the roadway at any time. The applicant or its successors shall notify the director of Transportation and Intergovernmental Relations of the construction employee parking locations, prior to commencement of construction.

#### **Public Works Department/Engineering**

15. The applicant shall submit a letter/report to the Public Works department from a geotechnical project engineer which addresses removals and recompaction, overexcavation requirements, and any other recommendations necessary for proper support of the proposed construction.
16. The applicant shall submit a letter/report to the Public Works department addressing the site drainage and to provide calculation of storm water runoffs.

17. All drainage shall be sloped 2% away from all part of the structure along impervious surface and 5% away along pervious surface.
18. Untreated impervious roof area shall be routed to water quality BMPs.
19. Prior to any work being performed within the City right-of-way, the applicant shall obtain an encroachment permit from the Public Works Department.
20. Construction activity and traffic control shall be staged such that vehicular access to adjacent properties is maintained at all times.
21. The applicant shall repair any broken or damaged curb, gutter, or pavement on Bon Homme Road along the project frontage to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.

**Public Works Department/Environmental Services Division**

22. During the term of the City permit, the contractor, their employees, and subcontractors shall implement appropriate Best Management Practices (BMPs) to prevent pollution to local storm drains and waterways. Sediments, construction debris, paint, trash, concrete truck wash water and other chemical waste from construction sites left on the ground and streets unprotected, or washed into storm drains, causes pollution in local waterways via the storm drain system is against City ordinances and State laws. The BMPs implemented shall be consistent with City of Calabasas Municipal Code Chapters 8.28. Failure to implement appropriate BMPs shall result in project delays through City issued "Stop Work Notices" and/or fines levied against the owner/developer/contractor.
23. The applicant and contractors shall implement all reasonable efforts to reuse and recycle 75% of construction and demolition debris, to use environmentally friendly materials, and to provide energy efficient buildings, equipment, and systems.
24. Per the Calabasas Municipal Code Chapter 8.16, "no person shall collect and/or dispose of municipal solid waste or recyclable materials in the city without having first been issued a solid waste collection permit. Such permit shall be in addition to any business license or permit otherwise required by the City of Calabasas." The following companies are the only trash haulers authorized to operate in the City of Calabasas: American Reclamation (1-888-999-9330), Consolidated Disposal Service (1-800-299-4898), Recology (1-800-633-9933), Universal Waste Systems (1-800-631-7016), Waste Management/G.I. Industries (1-800-675-1171). An Encroachment Permit from

the City Public Works Department is required prior to placing a refuse bin/container on any public street.

**Los Angeles County Fire Department**

25. Obtain any applicable permits and approvals from the Los Angeles County Fire Department.

**Section 5. All documents described in Section 1 of PC Resolution No. 2023-756 are deemed incorporated by reference as set forth at length.**
