II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A residential burglary occurred on Edgeware Drive. Suspects unknown, shattered the rear glass sliding door to make entry. Video surveillance footage showed two males making entry into the residence. The suspects fled in a black SUV-type vehicle driven by an additional suspect. (23-03641)

A theft was reported on Commons Way. The suspects were three females who concealed makeup items in pouches attached to the inside lining of their skirts and then exited without paying for the merchandise. (23-03578)

Three incidents involving the theft of a wallet and purses occurred on Commons Way and Calabasas Road. A wallet was stolen from the victim's purse as she was shopping at a grocery store on Calabasas Road. The victim's stolen credit card was used at another grocery store across the street by suspect(s) unknown. A purse was stolen from a grocery cart while the victim was shopping at a location on Commons Way. Video footage from this incident showed the suspects, two males and one female, between 25 to 35 years old, snatching the victim's purse from the shopping cart. The other theft of a purse occurred at a restaurant on Commons Way. Video footage showed a female suspect sitting behind the victim; then, she took the victim's purse which was on the ground and exited the location. (23-03326, 23-03434, 23-03915)

LOST HILLS JUVENILE INTERVENTION UNIT ACTIVITY REPORT FOR JULY 2023 CALABASAS

SCHOOL ISSUES

- LVUSD on summer break.
- Coordinated with all schools (public and private) in the city of Calabasas to schedule safety walk-throughs and critical incident tabletop scenario exercises (for staff).
- Assisted Calabasas High School regarding a student under the influence requiring hospital transport.

INTERVENTIONS

- Booked and processed a male adult at Lost Hills Station regarding cannabis sales to minors in multiple schools within LVUSD.
- Juvenile/Subject booked and processed at Lost Hills Station regarding LSD sales to another student resulting in a hospital transport of the student. The subject was referred to DYD CHAMPS Diversion.
- Counseled mother and 6-year-old student regarding; possible threats made at school because of being disciplined for behavioral issues. The determined statement was not viable and was a reaction to discipline only.

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

- 1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
- 2. We inquired with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
- 3. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month to keep her up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
- 4. Entered juveniles into the Youth Diversion Program for various violations.
- 5. We-investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
- 6. Met with station narcotic detectives to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug-related issues.
- 7. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel.
- 8. Conducted our routine checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile-related calls for service.

- 9. Conducted annual registration for 290 sex registrants in Calabasas jurisdiction.
- 10. Assisted Patrol re: CARP, backfill behind patrol/shortage, mandatory overtime.
