 - Body Positivity Faire - February 3
 - Oscar Melendez reported on progress they have made to get various speakers for the fair. He stated that Asha and he are thankful for the MYC's support.
 - Indigenous People's Day – October 12
 - The Cultural Awareness & Diversity subcommittee will provide a statement for the Mayor to read at the next City Council meeting and have confirmed Ms. Salazar-Folkes will attend the Pumpkin Festival.
 - Anti-Bullying Awareness Month - October
 - The PSA created by some MYC members was showcased.
 - Pumpkin Festival - October 22
 - MYC members were reminded that assistance is needed to run the Pumpkin Festival booth. Water bottles, bags, La La Land Café gift cards, sanitizer and chapstick will be distributed at the Pumpkin Festival as promotional items.

 - Avery reported on the success of the meet and greet with Assemblywoman Jacqui Irwin. In addition, Avery brought up the possibility of having a speaker night on the importance of pre-registering to vote.

 - Lauren mentioned updates on the MYC Instagram as well as her availability to work on flyers for the different MYC events. Dylan mentioned that the Communication & Technology Commission will be creating various videos for which they would like MYC member participation.
- Cultural Awareness & Diversity
 - MYC members recommended releasing a statement regarding the Israel/Hamas war to spread awareness. I was also brought up to possibly release such statement to the various high schools around the area,
