Calabasas Municipal Code, Sec. 2.40 ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW PANEL

- Planning Commission appoints ARP members
- Three Members and Two Alternates
 - ARP members should be "...persons who, as a result of their training, experience and attainments, are qualified to analyze and interpret architectural and site planning information."
 - At least one member must be a licensed architect.
 - Reside in or near the City or have business within the City.

Purpose of the ARP

- ❖ Preserve and enhance the beauty of the City's natural and built environment by:
 - Encouraging Citywide consistent building scale/character
 - Discouraging development of individual, dominant buildings
 - Ensuring attractive development that is in-character with the City
 - Encouraging structures which contribute to neighborhood and community

Ensure that:

- Site landscaping provides visually pleasing settings for structures,
- Landscaping blends harmoniously with the natural landscape,
- Landscaping supports the design and function of the structures,
- Views of structures from off-site are softened or screened
- Encourage the highest quality of architectural design, green building and construction methods which are the least disruptive to the site and community
- Balance private prerogatives and preferences with the general public interest and welfare
