ACTIVITY REPORT FOR OCTOBER 2023  
CALABASAS**

**SCHOOL ISSUES**

- Assisted Calabasas HS regarding threats made by two students.
- Assisted Calabasas HS regarding a student causing a disturbance.
- Assisted Calabasas HS regarding possible threats toward Westlake HS football team members.
- Assisted AE Wright regarding a student in possession of THC gummies on campus.
- Assisted AC Stelle regarding a student harassing a teacher via text messages.
- Consulted with Muse School regarding placement of Knox Boxes.
- Attended Calabasas HS assembly for a presentation on responsible social media use, possession of narcotics, fighting, bullying, and alcohol use.

**INTERVENTIONS**

Counseled a student and parents regarding a student harassing a teacher via text messages. All parties were receptive to counseling.

Counseled a student and parents regarding a student in possession of THC gummies on campus. Student to be issued a citation and referred to diversion.

**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

1. We spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question various juvenile concerns and issues in the community. We also provide the parents with resource programs within our community.
2. We inquired with the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney regarding the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
3. Met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo throughout the month to keep her up to date regarding our unit's investigations and current juvenile issues within our city.
4. Entered juveniles into the Youth Diversion Program for various violations.
5. We investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office. We additionally assisted other investigators in the preparation of cases for court.
6. Met with station narcotic detectives to exchange information regarding juvenile and drug-related issues.
7. Handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals brought to the attention of this unit for various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel.
8. Conducted our normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile-related calls for service.
9. Assisted Patrol regarding CARP, backfill behind patrol shortages, and mandatory overtime.
10. Ensured record sealing procedures were initiated for juveniles who completed the CHAMPS diversion program for minor offenses.

11. Attended monthly Safety Plan and Protocols meeting at LVUSD.
12. Assisted Calabasas High School regarding security and crowd control at football games.
