

WHEREAS, Congress declared in the National Historic Preservation Act that it shall be the policy of the federal government, in partnership with the state and local governments, "to foster conditions under which our modern society and our prehistoric and historic resources can exist in productive harmony"; and,

WHEREAS, the National Park Service and State of California through the Office of Historic Preservation. California State Parks, has established the Certified Local Government program to carry out this policy; and,

WHEREAS, the program recognizes local governments which have legislated a preservation program, including a qualified cultural resources commission which identifies and designates significant cultural resources to be protected for future generations and which advises the city council on actions which affect

WHEREAS, on July 24, 2009 the City of Calabasas has been approved by the State of California and the United States Department of the Interior to be a Certified Local Government, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the State Historical Resources Commission and the State Historic Preservation Officer invest with the City of Calabasas all the responsibilities and benefits of

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to the City of Calabasas.


#### Purpose:

To encourage local government participation in identification, evaluation, registration, and preservation interests and concerns.

# What does CLG mean for the HPC?

- Calabasas has been a Certified Local Government (CLG) for Historic Preservation since 2009; as such, the City of Calabasas is empowered with certain responsibilities and authorities under the federal and state laws governing historic resource protection.
- To achieve CLG status the City had to create and adopt a historic preservation ordinance (fully
  providing for all facets of historic preservation as specified by law), establish a Historic
  Preservation Commission, and conduct an inventory of historic resources in the City.
- To help ensure that we can continue carrying out our obligations and duties as a CLG, every
  year the Historic Preservation Commission members and staff must receive annual training and
  education on historic preservation law, applicable rules and guidelines, architecture and
  architectural history, and other matters relevant to historic preservation (2 hours minimum).
- Without CLG certification, reviews and decision-making concerning local landmarks would fall to the Calif. State Historic Preservation Office.

# Project Review - Commission Responsibilities

**Evaluation** 

The Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Guidelines are the basis for how the City reviews historic resources and projects.

Recommendation

Reviews must consider the most appropriate treatment(s) for, or in relation to, the subject resource, and whether proposed work will accomplish the treatment(s) in a manner consistent with the standards and guidelines.



A GLG's review authority encompasses local landmark designations, local historic district designations, Certificates of Appropriateness, Waivers, and Mills Act determinations.
