RESOLUTION NO. 2024-1902

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 FUNDED BY SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City of Calabasas are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calabasas must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calabasas, will receive an estimated \$594,562 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2024-25 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the eighth year in which the City of Calabasas is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City of Calabasas to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calabasas has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list by conducting public workshops and public meetings and publishing information on the City website; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calabasas used a Pavement Management System, followed Circulation and Safety Elements of the City's General Plan, and Safe Clean Water Program to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the funding from SB 1 will help the City of Calabasas maintain and rehabilitate low Pavement Condition Index (PCI) segments of streets/roads, manage stormwater, and add active transportation infrastructure throughout the City of Calabasas this year and plan for similar projects in the future; and

WHEREAS, the 2021 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City of Calabasas' streets and roads are in an "good" condition and this revenue will help us increase

the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into an "excellent" condition, improve safety for all travel modes and provide "green street" benefits; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the City Council of the City of Calabasas, State of California, as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The following list of newly proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with Fiscal Year 2024-25 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:

Project Title: 2025 Annual Street Resurfacing Program

<u>Project Description</u>: The program will overlay the street pavement based on the Pavement Management Index ratings.

<u>Project Location</u>: portions of Calabasas Road (West), Park Hermosa, Calamine Drive, Cangas Drive, Dantes View Drive, Gladiola Drive, Lilac Trail, and a segment of Park Capri to have "cool pavement" coating installed.

Estimated Project Schedule: Start (06/25) – Completion (09/25)

Estimated Project Useful Life: 15 years

<u>Project Title</u>: Old Topanga Canyon Road/Mulholland Highway Improvements Project, Phase II <u>Project Description</u>: The Project consists of improvements to approximately 2.4 miles of Mullholland Highway, including widening the road shoulder, realigning the roadway centerline as needed to provide wider shoulders, slope grading to prevent erosion, slope stabilization improvements, a retaining wall and intersection improvements.

<u>Project Location:</u> Mulholland Highway between Old Topanga Canyon Road (S) and the southern City limits

Estimated Project Schedule: Start (05/25) – Completion (10/26)

Estimated Project Useful Life: 25 years

3. The following previously proposed and adopted projects may also utilize Fiscal Year 2024-25 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues in their delivery. With the relisting of these projects in the adopted fiscal year resolution, the City of Calabasas is reaffirming to the public and the State our intent to fund these projects with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:

Project Title: 2024 Annual Street Resurfacing Program

<u>Project Description</u>: The program is to overlay the street pavement based on the Pavement

Management Index ratings.

<u>Project Location</u>: Las Virgenes Road between Parkmor Road and Mureau Road, Park Capri, Locust Drive, Daisy Trail, Clover Trail, a segment of Canyon Drive, raised crosswalk at Parkville Road.

Estimated Project Schedule: Start (06/24) – Completion (09/24)

Estimated Project Useful Life: 15 years

Project Title: West Calabasas Road Project

<u>Project Description</u>: The project will construct a roundabout at the intersection of Mureau Road and Calabasas Road, widen a portion of Calabasas Road and extend the existing bike lane and sidewalk on Calabasas Road. The completion of this project will help reduce vehicular speeds at the intersection, improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety, and beautify with new landscaping.

<u>Project Location</u>: Calabasas Road and Mureau Road intersection Estimated Project Schedule: Start: (10/24) – Completion: (6/25)

Estimated Project Useful Life: 25 years
