Re: After-Action Gate Opening Report

On May 30, 2024 the City of Calabasas conducted the first annual Gate Opening Drill. The goal was to open the gates within 30 minutes from a given time (10:00 am). These gates are crucial as secondary access/ingress emergency evacuation if Parkway Calabasas is blocked at any point due to fire, earthquake, water emergencies or other disasters.

Reverse 911 calls were sent to the security personnel to open up their gate(s) within 30 minutes from 10:00 am. All of the 5 gates tested were opened well before the required time. *The Parkway Calabasas Gate at the Oaks that leads to The Estates at The Oaks was opened but the traffic arms were left down to facilitate resident traffic during the exercise.

The city plan is to conduct these drills once a year, and the security companies plan to have these conducted quarterly.
