ACTIVITY REPORT FOR JULY 2024  
CALABASAS**

**SCHOOL ISSUES**

- All LVUSD schools are currently on summer break. The last day of school was June 12, 2024. The school will be back in session on August 21, 2024.
- The J-Team was notified of a trespassing event at Chaparral Elementary School. The juveniles were identified. All juveniles involved (and their parents) were counseled regarding the incident. The school district was not desirous of any criminal prosecution, counseling only.

**INTERVENTIONS**

**COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES**

- The J-Team is in the process of updating all critical information for all LVUSD schools, information that would be important to have during a critical incident at one of our schools.
- The J-Team is in the process of developing a critical incident training scenario for the staff within LVUSD. We are rolling out new and replacing old terminology for critical incidents at our schools (e.g., Active Shooter). The goal of new terminology is to mitigate confusion when handling specific incidents that can occur on campus (e.g., bomb threats, “swatting,” active shooter).
- The J-Team is planning an Active Shooter Scenario event at Lindero Canyon Middle School for Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff’s Station personnel. In partnership with Malibu Search and Rescue (MSAR), Conducted walk-thru of the middle school to plan scenario and logistics for event. Held several meetings with the logistical personnel to ensure a successful training scenario. The training event would apply to critical incidents across all schools that the station services.
- Troubleshoot “Knox Box” locking mechanisms. Knox Boxes are lock boxes strategically placed at our schools and contain master keys for the schools. The master keys give law enforcement personnel access to the entire school during a critical incident.
- The J-Team assisted in the investigation, arrest, and filing of two juveniles (confirmed gang members). They were arrested in the Calabasas area for possession of a loaded firearm, possession of a dirk or dagger, and vehicle burglary.
- The J-Team investigated and filed an assault incident that occurred at BMI Treatment Center in Calabasas. The incident is currently under review by the district attorney.
- The J-Team conducted a follow-up investigation for an assault incident that occurred at AE Wright Middle School during the prior school year. The investigation was conducted at the request of the Juvenile DA’s Office.

- The J-Team spoke with The Oaks Homeowners Association about the community's non-criminal and minor criminal events. The purpose of the discussion was to encourage more residents to come forward if they were affected by these incidents, prevent future occurrences, and identify the young individuals responsible for disturbing the community.
- The J-Team spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question juvenile concerns and community issues. We also provided the parents with resource programs within our community.
- The J-Team contacted the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney to inquire about the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
- Throughout the month, we met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo to inform her about our unit's investigations and current issues involving juveniles in our city.
- The J-Team assisted other investigators in preparing court cases and investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office.
- The J-Team handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals regarding various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel brought to the attention of this unit.
- The J-Team conducted normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile-related calls for service.
- The J-Team aided in patrolling for CARP, filled in for any patrol shortages, and worked mandatory overtime.
- The J-team conducted "290" Residential Verifications for sex registrants within the city of Calabasas jurisdiction.
