**LOST HILLS JUVENILE INTERVENTION UNIT
ACTIVITY REPORT FOR AUGUST 2024
CALABASAS**

SCHOOL ISSUES

- All LVUSD schools are currently on summer break. The last day of school was June 12, 2024. The school will be back in session on August 21, 2024.
- A battery incident occurred at Calabasas High School during the first week of school. The student was identified and booked for the crime.
- The J-Team provided security at Calabasas High School's football game.

INTERVENTIONS

COMMUNITY / CRIMINAL ISSUES

- Lost Hills Station participated in an active shooter training scenario at Lindero Canyon Middle School. The scenario included radio communication, multiple role players acting as victims, and live simulation round gunfire. Every deputy who participated completed monitors and a debrief. The goal of the scenario was to better prepare deputy personnel for a critical incident at any of the schools we serve.
- The J-Team is scheduling critical incident training dates for the staff within LVUSD and SMMUSD. We are rolling out new and replacing old terminology for critical incidents at our schools (e.g., Active Shooter). The goal of new terminology is to mitigate confusion when handling specific incidents that can occur on campus (e.g., bomb threats, "swatting," active shooter).
- The J-Team is planning an Active Shooter Scenario event at Lindero Canyon Middle School for Malibu/Lost Hills Sheriff's Station personnel. In partnership with Malibu Search and Rescue (MSAR), the J-Team conducted a walk-thru of the middle school to plan scenarios and logistics for the event. The team held several meetings with the logistical personnel to ensure a successful training scenario. The training event would apply to critical incidents across all schools that the station services.
- The J-Team conducted a tobacco compliance operation in Calabasas. The operation ensured merchants did not sell tobacco products to people under 21.
- The J-Team spoke with numerous citizens and parents who called to question juvenile concerns and community issues. We also provided the parents with resource programs within our community.
- The J-Team contacted the Sylmar Juvenile Court District Attorney to inquire about the investigation and filing of criminal charges against juvenile offenders.
- Throughout the month, we met with Captain Jennifer Seetoo to inform her about our unit's investigations and current issues involving juveniles in our city.
- The J-Team assisted other investigators in preparing court cases and investigated, prepared, and filed cases with the District Attorney's office.

- The J-Team handled the processing and follow-up of various juvenile referrals regarding various juvenile contacts with uniform personnel brought to the attention of this unit.
- The J-Team conducted normal checks of juvenile problem areas in the city during weekend evenings and responded to juvenile-related calls for service.
- The J-Team aided in patrolling for CARP, filled in for any patrol shortages, and worked mandatory overtime.
- The J-team conducted “290” Residential Verifications for sex registrants within the city of Calabasas jurisdiction.
