## Opening Matters - 2:30 P.M.:

Call to Order

The Panel selected Mark Handel as acting chair for this meeting. Mark Handel, Acting Chair, called the meeting to order at 2:30 P.M. Panel members in attendance: Camille Mugrdechian-Armen, Mark Handel, Jim Surdyk, and Will Shepphird. Panel Members absent: Ken Stockton (excused absence – recused because he is the project architect on the only agendized item). Staff members in attendance: Maureen Tamuri and Glenn Michitsch.

### General Discussion

Ken Stockton announced that he is recusing himself because he is the project architect, and leaving the room.

## Public Comments:

<u>Joe Chilco</u> – Commented on State density bonus law, density, and especially in regard to pervious surfaces in light of heavy rains this winter.

Norma Citron - Commented that the project is too dense, and concerned about height.

#### Review Item(s) – 2:35 P.M.

 File No. 150000964. A request for a Site Plan Review, Conditional Use Permit, General Plan Amendment, Zone Change and Oak Tree Permit to demolish an existing 2-story office building and construction of a new approximately 44,000 square-foot mixed use project, which includes 1,620 square-feet of commercial retail space and 42 age restricted residential units. The applicant is requesting to change the General Plan land use designation from Business-Professional Office (B-PO) to Mixed Use 0.95 (MU 0.95) and the zoning designation from Commercial Office (CO) to Commercial Mixed-Use (CMU). The proposed project includes five (5) affordable housing units located on-site and designated for very low income seniors (55+). The applicant is requesting a height concession and a density bonus for providing 10% very low income units. The subject site is located at 23480 Park Sorrento, within the Commercial Office zoning district.

Project applicant, Rick Stockton, described the revisions made to the project since the last ARP review. The Panel made the following suggestions:

- Visibility of rooftop equipment is a concern. All rooftop equipment should be concealed
- Project should minimize downspouts, and those that will be visible should architecturally blend with the style of the building
- Project should harmonize ratios of the roof tile to building massing by gathering roof tower elements
- Main tower element needs to be architecturally significant, and treated similarly on all visible sides. Consider stopping stone veneer short of the clock location and include a cornice element
- Clock element on the clock tower should be more visually prominent
- Consider softening the east side of the north elevation by adding streetside elements such as an extension of the arcade through the entire width of the project, or by adding a trellis to the northeast corner
- Use hand troweled elements on some portions of the plaster surfaces of the structure, especially the more visible portions

The Panel overall recommended that the project address the Panel's comments and come back to a future meeting.
