
1. Basic Search



2. Subject Search

If you want to search by subject, click on the dropdown and move the highlighted area to subject. Type a keyword in the text box and a list of possible subjects will be displayed. Choose one and hit the search icon. Articles on that subject will be displayed. Continue your search by typing keywords into the “Search Within” results text box on the right side of the screen.

3. Advanced Search
