
The Calabasas Library includes text and online resources in a variety of formats. Locate books, newspaper and magazine articles, scholarly journal articles, or **REF**erence materials in the library or from the Library Home page

PRIMARY SOURCES are original documents, records, or firsthand accounts of an event. Some examples are court records, letters, diaries, speeches, paintings, photographs, newspaper articles, even memories of an event gathered in an interview. The format of a primary source may vary (text, website, recording, etc.) but the content of the primary source

must be of the **same time period** as your subject.

SECONDARY SOURCES describe and interpret events and primary source materials that have already occurred. Some examples are biographies, books about a single topic (or monographs), textbooks, documentary films, magazine and journal articles.

Books provide specialized, in depth information about your topic. Here is a sample search in the library online catalog.



Reference sources are located next to the Reference Desk. Use the index to find specific topics or concepts. Reference books do not circulate; copies are \$.25 a page.

1. Gale Reference Books online

From the *Library Home page* select databases then **Gale Virtual Reference Library**. Enter your library bar code and click **Proceed**. Entries include current MLA citation information

Select Subject History, or Biography, click the View All button, then Search by book Title:



2. Gale World History in Context

From the *Library Home page* select **databases** then **World History in Context.**Enter your library bar code and click **Proceed**. Entries include current MLA citation information
Three ways to search: 1. Type keyword search *or* 2. Select

Browse Topics to view all topics

or 3. Select a **Category** (ex: **Countries, Cultures, and Civilizations**) then View All to narrow your search.
