SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve an amendment to Articles of Agreement with Venco Western Inc. to improve irrigation system on Thousand Oaks Boulevard.

BACKGROUND:

On June 12, 2014, the City Council approved a contract with Venco Western, Inc. for the Implementation of Citywide Smart irrigation Control System Project. Phase I of the project was completed in early October.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

The Smart irrigation Control System project consisted of 2 phases:

- 1. Implementation of Citywide Smart Irrigation Control System project
- 2. Improvement to Recycled Water Irrigation System

Phase I of the project was successfully implemented and the new smart controllers are up and running. There is a remaining balance in City's grant funding that needs to be spent on Phase II that consist of improving recycled water irrigation system by the end of this calendar year. Currently, the irrigation system on Thousand Oaks Boulevard requires major upgrade to improve water distribution efficiency and reduce run-off. Amending the existing contract with Venco Western, Inc. will save mobilization cost considering the time constraint required to complete the project on schedule.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

City Council approved the budget for the Smart Irrigation Control Project in September 12, 2012. The cost of this contract will be paid thru account No. 40-319-6503-24.

REQUESTED ACTION:

That the City Council approve an amendment to Articles of Agreement with Venco Western Inc. to improve irrigation system on Thousand Oaks Boulevard.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

As requested by Council at their last meeting, Resolution No. 1214-1438 supporting the project to build a wildlife corridor on the Ventura Freeway (US 101) at Liberty Canyon in Agoura Hills is being presented for consideration.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Calabasas lies within the Santa Monica Mountains. Maintaining and protecting the ecosystem of the Santa Monica Mountains is critical to maintaining and protecting the economic and social values of Calabasas' residents.

Over the years, the Santa Monica Mountains area has suffered habitat degradation and species loss due to isolation from other natural habitat areas as the result of human development. In particular, the habitats have become totally isolated by the US 101 and Interstate 405 (I-405) freeways.

The region's wildlife is suffering from that isolation and the ecosystem of the Santa Monica Mountains is threatened with long term degradation if the isolation persists. The apex predator of the Santa Monica Mountains, the mountain lion, has shown

signs of increased conflict and genetic defects as a result of its inability to disperse. Because local urban parklands are bordered by major freeways, it is nearly impossible for mountain lions and other wildlife to cross safely into new territories. Without free movement, the wildlife is threatened with loss of genetic diversity and territorial disputes, much of which is caused by the dangers of crossing multilane freeways.

A growing group of advocates, including the National Park Service, Caltrans, Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority, Resource Conservation District of the Santa Monica Mountains, National Wildlife Foundation, Santa Monica Mountains Fund, the City of Agoura Hills and others, have joined together on a project to build a wildlife corridor across US 101 at Liberty Canyon in order to link protected habitats on either side of the freeway. The passage will provide mountain lions and other wildlife safe passage to find food and mates, and will improve the genetic diversity of both the flora and fauna of the Santa Monica Mountains ecosystem.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS, CALIFORNIA SUPPORTING THE PROJECT TO BUILD A WILDLIFE CORRIDOR ON THE VENTURA FREEWAY (US 101) AT LIBERTY CANYON IN AGOURA HILLS.

Maintaining and protecting the ecosystem of the Santa Monica Mountains is critical to maintaining and protecting the economic and social values of Calabasas' residents; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS hereby supports the project to build a wildlife corridor on US 101 at Liberty Canyon in Agoura Hills to protect the ongoing health of the Santa Monica

Mountains ecosystem and preserve this natural heritage for Calabasas' residents today and in the future.




A good rule of thumb:

- 1kW of solar will generate about 1,700 kWh/year
- Divide annual consumption (kWh) by 1700 kWh/year


For example:

The Smith residence consumes 6,000 kWh/year.
 6,000 kWh/1,700kWh = 3.5 kW

Leasing a PV System

- Financial arrangement wherein the system is owned and managed by a third party, who then sells electricity to the property owner.
- Typically a zero cash down payment by the property owner with a monthly payment to the leasing company. The payment is significantly lower than normal utility billing.

 More than 30 days after submittal of a complete application to complete the structural building safety plan check of the applicant's set of plans and specifications which are suitable for checking

The Building and Safety Plan Check Process PV Systems - Turn-Around Time

Very quick turn-around-time

2 days or less

CA Assembly Bill 1801-Campos September 25, 2012

Prohibits any city from basing the permit fee charged for a PV system on the valuation of the system, or any other factor not directly associated with the cost to issue the permit

CA Senate Bill 1222 - Leno September 27, 2012

Bill requires permit fees for <u>rooftop</u> PV systems to not exceed cost of providing the service for which the fee is charged. Maximum fees established as follows:

- Residential systems \$500 plus \$15 per kilowatt for each kilowatt above 15kW.
- Commercial systems \$1,000 plus \$7 per kilowatt for each kilowatt between 51kW and 250kW, plus \$5 for every kilowatt above 250kW.

Calabasas PV permit fees are well within compliance.





Solar Plan Preparation Guidelines

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Solar Plan Preparation Guidelines

This information bulletin provides information about submittal and plan review for Solar Photovoltaic (PV Systems.

APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS

An electrical permit is required for the installation of all PV systems. A building permit or combination permit for installations on single family dwellings or duplex projects, may be required if structural modification to existing construction are proposed to support the PV system; and will be required for all new structures such as trellises, patio covers, canopies, platforms etc. that support PV systems when such structures would otherwise be exempt from a building permit.

PV systems shall comply with all applicable requirements, City ordinances and regulations including zoning, structure height, and conditions of prior development permits governing the site.

I. SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

The following plans and documents shall be provided along with the appropriate fees.

A. Application Package

1. Provide one copy of the Building Project Identification form.

B. Plans

1. Residential installations per Solar PV Standard Electrical Plans (Standard Plans)

These Standard Plans were developed to guide you in preparing residential solar PV plans for systems less than 10kW. These Standard Plans shall be used only for a residential PV project when installed on a sloped roof with the panel weight of five pounds per square foot or less. Provide the following items for submittal:

- Two copies of the Standard Plan. The Standard Plan sheets shall be modified to reflect the actual projectspecific details.
- b. Two copies of the manufacturer's specifications for the proposed PV panels with all electrical information.
- c. Two copies of the manufacturer's specifications for the proposed PV inverter(s) showing all electrical information.

All Other Plan

Commercial installations and residential installation where the Standard Plans cannot be used; provide two sets of each of the following plans and documents:

a Site Plan

The site plan for ground mounted PV system must show property lines and setback dimensions. For roof mounted PV systems, provide a site plan with the property lines showing the footprint of the building and the location of the PV system on the building or structure.

Provide a detailed roof plan showing the slope of the roof and location of the array on the roof in relation to any ridge, hip or valley. The plans must also include the site address, legal description, assessor's parcel number, and property owner's name/address.

Include a plan showing the location of all existing and proposed PV panels, AC or DC combiners, all disconnects inverters sub-panels connected to the solar PV system and the meter panel.

b. Single Line Diagram

An electrical one-line diagram showing the number of photovoltaic panels (include the manufacturer model number) with voltage and killowatt output, all disconnects, all combiners, all inverters (include the manufacturer model number) with input ratings, the ampere rating of any sub-panels connected to the PV system, the ampere rating of the meter panel bussing, the ampere rating of the main service disconnect, the ampere rating of the PV circuit breaker, site and type of all raceways and the site and type of all conductors.

c. Framing Pla

Roof mounted solar projects shall include a framing plan showing the supporting structure and the attachment of the panels to the structure of the roof. If using pre-manufactured racking systems, provide the manufacturer's installation specifications.

Provide a cross-section showing the height of the proposed PV panel above the roof, the supporting structure and the distance down the slope from any roof ridge.

Where alterations are required to existing structures to support and provide attachment for PV systems, structural plans shall be provided that are sufficient in detail and scope to demonstrate the required load path to the pround

Ground mounted arrays shall include a framing plan showing the supporting structure and the attachment of the panels to the structure and must include details that are sufficient in detail and scope to show the load path to the ground.

d Manufacturer's Flectrical Data Sheets

Include one copy of the manufacturer's specifications for the proposed PV modules, inverter(s) and meter with all of their electrical information.

e.Signature on Plans


All plans shall be signed and stamped in accordance with the California Business and Professions Code. PV Plans may be signed and stamped by a registered electrical engineer or a licensed electrical contractor (C-10 License) or a solar contractor (C-40 License) who is responsible for the installation of the system. A general contract (Poli-License) may also sign the plans only if the PV Panels are installed in a new building or new addition area. A registered architect, civil engineer or structural engineer shall sign and stamp structural plans and calculations when required.

III. OTHER REQUIREMENTS

A. Structural Plan Review

- A structural review and structural calculations for roof-mounted installations will be required for the following cases:
- 1. Where alterations to the structure are required to support and provide an attachment for PV systems;
- 2. PV array exceeds five pounds per square foot;
- 3. Any piece of equipment weighing more than 400 pounds;
- 4. Mounting height above the roof is greater than 30 inches;
- The array is mounted with a ballasted system or a ground mounted PV systems located more than five ft. above the ground.

CA Assembly Bill 2188 - Muratshuchi September 21, 2014



 Adopt an ordinance for an expedited, streamlined permitting process for small residential rooftop solar energy systems on or before September 30, 2015.



Prohibits "conditioning" the approval of any solar energy system
permit when a property is part of an HOA; and also places limitations
on any restriction or condition contained in any instrument affecting
the transfer or sale of property effectively prohibiting or restricting
the installation or use of a solar energy system.



 Inspect a small residential rooftop solar energy system eligible for expedited review in a timely manner.



Requires a solar water heating systems to be certified by an accredited listing agency.



Requires written notification to permit applicants within 45 days of receipt of the application if the application is denied.

CA Assembly Bill 2188 - Muratshuchi What Impact's to the City?

On or before September 15, 2015, we shall adopt an Ordinance consistent with the goals of AB2188:

- Streamlined permit process and checklists for small roof mounted projects (10kw and less), consistent with the latest guide book prepared by the Governor's Office of Planning and Research.
- On-line permit issuance for small roof top mounted systems, unless, the Ordinance that is prepared as stated above, describes why the City does not have that capability to do so.
- Denial of permit issuance may be appealable to the Planning Commission.
- Any conditions imposed upon a project to install solar systems, shall be at the lowest cost possible.
- Combination Inspection Required

City Council Considerations

- On-line Permits. Currently, Building and Safety does not have the capability to issue on-line permits. Software with said capability cost roughly between \$300,000 to \$500,000. However; the City of Burbank, which hosts the Calabasas "Edgesoft" permit software, will soon be launching web based permits. Staff can report to Council in early 2015 with an up-date.
- Expedited Permit Process. Currently we provide a 2 day turnaround with consultant plan check staff present at the office of Building and Safety every Tuesday and Thursday. At an additional cost, we can provide same day review services.
- Fees. Council may consider waiving or lower the current fee schedule as established by 2011-1304
