SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

It recommended that the City Council approve a Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with Secural Security Corporation for security at various City facilities and citywide parking enforcement citation services for a three year period.

BACKGROUND:

Secural Security Corporation was founded in 1976 and has been proving security services to the City of Calabasas since 1995. Specifically, they have provided security officer services at various City events when requested, after-hours vehicle patrol service for the Civic Center and recently the Senior Center, Creekside and De Anza parks and the Tennis and Swim Center. Secural also provides locking and unlocking of public restrooms and Gates Canyon and Grape Arbor Parks as well as other facilities. In addition, they provide citywide parking enforcement citation services on an as needed basis and specific enforcement as directed by the City.

Over the years, this Calabasas business has developed excellent relationships with the Sheriff's Department, School District as well as the City. Secural is endorsed by the Lost Hills Sheriff's Department to handle routine matters typically serviced by municipal law enforcement, in the areas of traffic control, road closures and parking enforcement filling in the gap between the public and private sector services freeing the Sheriff to concentrate their focus on traditional law enforcement and crime prevention duties.

Secural provides a unique combination of services not offered by other security firms and include but are not limited to: Uniformed armed and unarmed Security Officers, plain clothes armed and unarmed security and off duty police officers, armed vehicle patrol, remote video surveillance linked to their patrol cars and corporate offices, remote video surveillance of the Civic Center, Old Town Park and Ride Facility and De Anza Park and parking enforcement citation services.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

For the past several years, Secural has provided security services at various large scale special City events such as the Pumpkin Festival, Arts Festival, and 4th of July Celebration. The local knowledge and familiarity they have acquired over the years is invaluable to the City. Their homegrown expertise of City events and personnel eases the planning and implementation of the various events and programs and has contributed to the success in providing the community with family friendly and safe events.

Since 2011, in conjunction with the endorsement of the Lost Hills Sheriff's Department, the City has contracted with Secural to provide regular and selective parking enforcement citation services. This has provided significant net revenues after fees and has increased safety on the roads for both pedestrians and vehicles.

The scope of services for this new three-year PSA includes the increases related to the minimum wage increase and raising costs associated with Workers Compensation and General Liability insurances. The increase in 2017 amount to approximately 4%, 3% in 2018, 2% in 2019 and 2% in 2020 related to the hourly rates. Additionally, the monthly charge to Alarm Service/Armed Response increase 8% in 2017, 7% in 2018, 6% in 2019 and 5% in 2020. Similar increases are called for related to monthly Vehicle Patrol and City-Wide Parking Enforcement Citation Services.

The City has been very pleased with services provided over the years by Secural Security Corporation. They continue to work seamlessly with staff and outside agencies and are viewed as an extension of the local law enforcement services provided by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. They continue to work

cooperatively in the community and to incorporate innovative technologies that provide improved services to the citizens of Calabasas. City staff highly recommends Secural and looks forward to continuing this beneficial and productive relationship.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

Approximately \$37,000 for FY 2017 to \$44,000 in FY 2020 from account 10-134-5254-84 for parking enforcement citation services based on a minimum of 25 hours per month. Additional requests for specific services for problem areas will be invoiced separately.

Approximately \$55,000 per year paid from the following accounts related to specific events for security services; 10-512-5252, 10-513-5252, 10-514-5252, 10-516-5252, 10-517-5252 and 50-521-5252.

Approximately \$7,500 per year paid from the following accounts based on specific facility for patrol service/armed response; 10-512-5252, 10-513-5252, 10-514-5252, 10-517-5252, 50-521-5252, 10-136-5500-01, 28-136-5500-01 and 10-518-5500-01.

Approximately \$9,500 per year from the following accounts based on facility, for patrol locking and unlocking facility restrooms; 10-513-5252, 10-514-5252 and 10-518-5252.

Revenue generation annually, estimated at \$100,000 - \$150,000 based on past years, posted to account 10-000-4311-00.

REQUESTED ACTION:

It is requested that the City Council approve a Professional Services Agreement with Secural Security Corporation in an amount not to exceed \$300,000 for security and parking enforcement citation services for three years.

ITEM 2 ATTACHMENT PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

City of Calabasas / Secural Security Corporation

1. <u>IDENTIFICATION</u>

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Calabasas, a California municipal corporation ("City"), and Secural Security Corporation ("Consultant").

2. RECITALS

- 2.1 City has determined that it requires the following professional services from a consultant: Security Officers, Armed Response and Patrol, Facility Locking/Unlocking and Parking Enforcement Citation Services..
- 2.2 Consultant represents that it is fully qualified to perform such professional services by virtue of its experience and the training, education and expertise of its principals and employees. Consultant further represents that it is willing to accept responsibility for performing such services in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained, City and Consultant agree as follows:

3. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

- 3.1 "Scope of Services": Such professional services as are set forth in Consultant's proposal to City attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 3.2 "Approved Fee Schedule": Such compensation rates as are set forth in Consultant's fee schedule to City attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 3.3 "Commencement Date": October 1, 2017.
- 3.4 "Expiration Date": October 1, 2020.

4. <u>TERM</u>

The term of this Agreement shall commence at 12:00 a.m. on the Commencement Date and shall expire at 11:59 p.m. on the Expiration Date unless extended by written agreement of the parties or terminated earlier in accordance with Section 17 ("Termination") below.

5. <u>CONSULTANT'S SERVICES</u>

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- 5.1 Consultant shall perform the services identified in the Scope of Services. City shall have the right to request, in writing, changes in the Scope of Services. Any such changes mutually agreed upon by the parties, and any corresponding increase or decrease in compensation, shall be incorporated by written amendment to this Agreement. In no event shall the total compensation and costs payable to Consultant under this Agreement exceed the sum of Three Hundred **Thousand Dollars** (\$300,000.00) unless specifically approved in advance and in writing by City.
- 5.2 Consultant shall perform all work to the highest professional standards of Consultant's profession and in a manner reasonably satisfactory to City. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, including the conflict of interest provisions of Government Code Section 1090 and the Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000 et seq.).
- 5.3 During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall not perform any work for another person or entity for whom Consultant was not working at the Commencement Date if both (i) such work would require Consultant to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute and (ii) City has not consented in writing to Consultant's performance of such work.
- 5.4 Consultant represents that it has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required to perform the services identified in the Scope of Services. All such services shall be performed by Consultant or under its supervision, and all personnel engaged in the work shall be qualified to perform such services. AJ Scola shall be Consultant's project administrator and shall have direct responsibility for management of Consultant's performance under this Agreement. No change shall be made in Consultant's project administrator without City's prior written consent.

6. COMPENSATION

- 6.1 City agrees to compensate Consultant for the services provided under this Agreement, and Consultant agrees to accept in full satisfaction for such services, payment in accordance with the Approved Fee Schedule.
- 6.2 Consultant shall submit to City an invoice, on a monthly basis or less frequently, for the services performed pursuant to this Agreement. Each invoice shall itemize the services rendered during the billing period and the amount due. Within ten business days of receipt of each invoice, City shall notify Consultant in writing of any disputed amounts included on the invoice. Within thirty calendar days of receipt of each invoice, City shall pay all undisputed amounts included on the invoice. City shall not withhold applicable taxes or other authorized deductions

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6.3 Payments for any services requested by City and not included in the Scope of Services shall be made to Consultant by City on a time-and-materials basis using Consultant's standard fee schedule. Consultant shall be entitled to increase the fees in this fee schedule at such time as it increases its fees for its clients generally; provided, however, in no event shall Consultant be entitled to increase fees for services rendered before the thirtieth day after Consultant notifies City in writing of an increase in that fee schedule. Fees for such additional services shall be paid within sixty days of the date Consultant issues an invoice to City for such services.

7. OWNERSHIP OF WRITTEN PRODUCTS

All reports, documents or other written material ("written products" herein) developed by Consultant in the performance of this Agreement shall be and remain the property of City without restriction or limitation upon its use or dissemination by City. Consultant may take and retain copies of such written products as desired, but no such written products shall be the subject of a copyright application by Consultant.

8. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Consultant is, and shall at all times remain as to City, a wholly independent contractor. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise to act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not represent that it is, or that any of its agents or employees are, in any manner employees of City.

9. CONFIDENTIALITY

All data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without prior written consent by City. City shall grant such consent if disclosure is legally required. Upon request, all City data shall be returned to City upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

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10. **INDEMNIFICATION**

- 10.1 The parties agree that City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers should, to the fullest extent permitted by law, be protected from any and all loss, injury, damage, claim, lawsuit, cost, expense, attorneys' fees, litigation costs, or any other cost arising out of or in any way related to the performance of this Agreement. Accordingly, the provisions of this indemnity provision are intended by the parties to be interpreted and construed to provide the City with the fullest protection possible under the law. Consultant acknowledges that City would not enter into this Agreement in the absence of Consultant's commitment to indemnify and protect City as set forth herein.
- 10.2 To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims and losses, costs or expenses for any damage due to death or injury to any person and injury to any property resulting from any alleged intentional, reckless, negligent, or otherwise wrongful acts, errors or omissions of Consultant or any of its officers, employees, servants, agents, or subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement. Such costs and expenses shall include reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by counsel of City's choice.
- 10.3 City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any compensation due Consultant under this Agreement any amount due City from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to pay City promptly any indemnification arising under this Section 10 and related to Consultant's failure to either (i) pay taxes on amounts received pursuant to this Agreement or (ii) comply with applicable workers' compensation laws.
- 10.4 The obligations of Consultant under this Section 10 will not be limited by the provisions of any workers' compensation act or similar act. Consultant expressly waives its statutory immunity under such statutes or laws as to City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers.
- 10.5 Consultant agrees to obtain executed indemnity agreements with provisions identical to those set forth here in this Section 10 from each and every subcontractor or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. In the event Consultant fails to obtain such indemnity obligations from others as required herein, Consultant agrees to be fully responsible and indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims and losses, costs or expenses for any damage due to death or injury to any person and injury to any property resulting from any alleged intentional, reckless, negligent, or otherwise wrongful acts, errors or omissions of Consultant's subcontractors or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of

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- Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. Such costs and expenses shall include reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by counsel of City's choice.
- 10.6 City does not, and shall not waive any rights that it may possess against Consultant because of the acceptance by City, or the deposit with City, of any insurance policy or certificate required pursuant to this Agreement. This hold harmless and indemnification provision shall apply regardless of whether or not any insurance policies are determined to be applicable to the claim, demand, damage, liability, loss, cost or expense.

11. INSURANCE

- 11.1 During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall carry, maintain, and keep in full force and effect insurance against claims for death or injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with Consultant's performance of this Agreement. Such insurance shall be of the types and in the amounts as set forth below:
 - 11.1.1 Comprehensive General Liability Insurance with coverage limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) including products and operations hazard, contractual insurance, broad form property damage, independent consultants, personal injury, underground hazard, and explosion and collapse hazard where applicable.
 - 11.1.2 Automobile Liability Insurance for vehicles used in connection with the performance of this Agreement with minimum limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claimant and One Million dollars (\$1,000,000) per incident.
 - 11.1.3 Worker's Compensation insurance as required by the laws of the State of California.
- 11.2 Consultant shall require each of its subcontractors to maintain insurance coverage that meets all of the requirements of this Agreement.
- 11.3 The policy or policies required by this Agreement shall be issued by an insurer admitted in the State of California and with a rating of at least A:VII in the latest edition of Best's Insurance Guide.
- 11.4 Consultant agrees that if it does not keep the aforesaid insurance in full force and effect, City may either (i) immediately terminate this Agreement; or (ii) take out the necessary insurance and pay, at Consultant's expense, the premium thereon.

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- 11.5 At all times during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall maintain on file with City's Risk Manager a certificate or certificates of insurance showing that the aforesaid policies are in effect in the required amounts and naming the City and its officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds. Consultant shall, prior to commencement of work under this Agreement, file with City's Risk Manager such certificate(s).
- 11.6 Consultant shall provide proof that policies of insurance required herein expiring during the term of this Agreement have been renewed or replaced with other policies providing at least the same coverage. Such proof will be furnished at least two weeks prior to the expiration of the coverages.
- 11.7 The General Liability Policy of insurance required by this Agreement shall contain an endorsement naming City and its officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds. The General Liability Policy required under this Agreement shall contain an endorsement providing that the policies cannot be canceled or reduced except on thirty days' prior written notice to City. Consultant agrees to require its insurer to modify the certificates of insurance to delete any exculpatory wording stating that failure of the insurer to mail written notice of cancellation imposes no obligation, and to delete the word "endeavor" with regard to any notice provisions.
- 11.8 The insurance provided by Consultant shall be primary to any coverage available to City. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by City and/or its officers, employees, agents or volunteers, shall be in excess of Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 11.9 All insurance coverage provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not prohibit Consultant, and Consultant's employees, agents or subcontractors, from waiving the right of subrogation prior to a loss. Consultant hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the City.
- 11.10 Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. At the option of City, Consultant shall either reduce or eliminate the deductibles or self-insured retentions with respect to City, or Consultant shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and expenses.
- 11.11 Procurement of insurance by Consultant shall not be construed as a limitation of Consultant's liability or as full performance of Consultant's duties to indemnify, hold harmless and defend under Section 10 of this Agreement.

12. <u>MUTUAL COOPERATION</u>

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- 12.1 City shall provide Consultant with all pertinent data, documents and other requested information as is reasonably available for the proper performance of Consultant's services under this Agreement.
- 12.2 In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance in connection with this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance that City may require.

13. <u>RECORDS AND INSPECTIONS</u>

14. <u>PERMITS AND APPROVALS</u>

Consultant shall obtain, at its sole cost and expense, all permits and regulatory approvals necessary in the performance of this Agreement. This includes, but shall not be limited to, encroachment permits and building and safety permits and inspections.

15. NOTICES

Scope #1 Standing Security Officer Services

SECURAL shall provide standing officers for security, crowd management, emergency incidents, and traffic control services for City events when requested by the City.

Scope #2 Vehicle Patrol Service-Armed Response Service

SECURAL shall provide twelve (12) hours of vehicle patrol service during the hours of darkness for the Civic Center (City Hall, Library, Senior Center), Creekside Park, Juan Bautista De Anza Park and the Tennis and Swim Center as well as twenty-four (24) hours response to Civic Center elevator emergencies when the automated elevator call system contacts Secural.



SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve a contract with RC Becker and Son in the amount of \$191,088.26 which includes a 15% contingency for the construction of the Malibu Hills Road Stormwater Enhancement Project, to appropriate \$7,500 to Converse Consultants for performing quality control and material testing services; appropriate \$10,000 to KOA Corporation for construction management services, for a total of \$208,588.26 to cover all costs associated with this project and to adjust the budget accordingly.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Calabasas completed the installation of over 1,016 catch basin retractable screens as part of the implementation of the Citywide Storm Drain Catch Basin Curb Screen Project. The objective of this project was to prevent trash, debris, sediment, and vegetation from entering the storm drain and eventually polluting creeks, rivers, and beaches.

During the recent rainfalls, the screens proved to be effective, improving the quality of creeks, rivers and beaches in the process. The project was completed with a ribbon-cutting ceremony in January 27, 2016.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

Initially the project proposed to install curb screens on 1,150 catch basins in the City of Calabasas. One Hundred Thirty Four (134) catch basins were not retrofitted by curb screens due to sump situation or other technical reasons. This left the City with an excess of unused budget/funding in the amount of \$208,085.00. The California Department of Water Resources has authorized the City to use the unspent funding on other storm water-related concepts.

The City of Calabasas continued its efforts to reduce and prevent storm water contamination of its rivers and streams by repurposing these funds into a continuation of the Citywide Storm Drain Catch Basin Curb Screen Project with concepts that provide additional benefits in alignment to the original intent of the grant funding.

The new concept will be implemented in Malibu Hills Road beginning at 194 feet east of Lost Hills Road and ending at the road terminus at the east. This segment of road is approximately 60 to 70 feet wide with no catch basins for surface flow drainage. The Lack of catch basins in the area contributes to the water ponding at low points at some sections of the street.

Stormwater from this area is being discharged into Las Virgenes Creek which is part of the Malibu Creek Watershed. The Malibu Creek Watershed is a significant ecological system in Los Angeles County and the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area.

The City of Calabasas proposed the addition of a bio-retention center median with an impermeable liner and underdrain to convey storm water to a nearby catch basin. The underdrain would connect to the existing catch basin to discharge treated flows. The medians would also serve as a pretreatment best management practice (BMP) that will capture and treat surface flows.

According to the Los Angeles Low Impact Development Manual, bio-retention areas have several benefits including the retention of stormwater runoff and elimination of pollutant discharge. In addition, the bio-filtration media inside the system filters out pollutants in the surface flows therefore improving the water quality.

Overall, the water quality in the Malibu Creek watershed is an integral part of life for wildlife, fish and humans. The implementation of the Malibu Hills Road

Stormwater Enhancement Project would give the City of Calabasas an opportunity to remove pollutants and increase flood control in this area.

After completing the design and specifications, the City issued a Request for Proposal on August 15, 2017. A total of 2 bids were received on September 12, 2017.

After careful evaluation and verification of licenses, references and qualifications, RC Becker and Son was deemed to be the lowest qualified responsive bidder.

Staff recommends increasing the proposed amount by 15% for contingency as the additional contingency amount of \$24,924.56 will be to address unforeseen conditions that may be encountered on the project during the construction phase.

Staff recommends appropriating \$7,500 for inspection, quality control and material testing services for this project. The services will be provided by Converse Consultants, the City's on-call material testing & special inspection services consultant. Staff also recommends appropriating \$10,000 for construction management which will be provided by KOA Corporation, the City's on-call construction management consultant. The proposed amounts for both services are reasonable for a project of this type and magnitude. The available grant funding from California Department of Water Resources is \$208,085.00. A total of \$18,160.00 will be spent on the installation of a recycled water meter by another contractor.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

The remaining balance of \$189,925.00 will be spent toward the project. Staff requests additional funding in the amount of \$18,663.26 from the City's Annual NPDES Budget (account No. 10-313-5252-00) to be appropriated to cover the difference of costs. Staff is recommends appropriations for the total amount of \$208,588.26 to cover all costs associated with this project.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve a contract with RC Becker and Son in the amount of \$191,088.26 which includes a 15% contingency for the construction of the Malibu Hills Road Stormwater Enhancement Project, to appropriate \$7,500 to Converse Consultants for performing quality control and material testing services; appropriate \$10,000 to KOA Corporation for construction

management services, for a total of \$208,588.26 to cover all costs associated with this project and to adjust the budget accordingly.

THIS MALIBU HILLS ROAD STORMWATER ENHANCEMENT PROJECT, SPECIFICATION NO. 17-18-03, AGREEMENT ("AGREEMENT") is made and entered into for the above-stated project this 27th day of September, 2017, BY AND BETWEEN the City of Calabasas, a municipal corporation, hereafter designated as "AGENCY", and R.C. BECKER AND SON, INC, a California Corporation, hereafter designated as "CONTRACTOR."

WITNESSETH that AGENCY and CONTRACTOR have mutually agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I: Contract Documents

The contract documents for the MALIBU HILLS ROAD STORMWATER ENHANCEMENT PROJECT, SPECIFICATION NO. 17-18-03, shall consist of the Notice Inviting Sealed Bids, Instructions To Bidders, Bid Proposal, Bid Schedule, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, and all referenced specifications, details, standard drawings, and appendices; together with two signed copies of the AGREEMENT, two signed copies of required bonds; one copy of the insurance certificates, permits, notices, and affidavits; and also including any and all addenda or supplemental agreements clarifying, amending, or extending the work contemplated as may be required to ensure its completion in an acceptable manner (collectively referred to herein as the "Contract Documents"). All of the provisions of the Contract Documents are made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE II: Scope of Work

For and in consideration of the payments and agreements to be made and performed by AGENCY, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish all materials and equipment and perform all work required for the above-stated project, and to fulfill all other obligations as set forth in the aforesaid Contract Documents.

AGENCY hereby employs CONTRACTOR to provide the materials, do the work, and fulfill the obligations according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to, for the prices provided herein, and hereby contracts to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions set forth in this AGREEMENT.

In entering into a public works contract or a subcontract to supply goods, services, or materials pursuant to this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR offers and agrees to assign to the AGENCY all rights, title, and interest in and to all causes of action it may have under Section 4 of the Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. Sec. 15) or under the Cartwright Act (Chapter 2 (Section 16700, et seq.) of Part 2 of Division 7 of the Business and Professions Code), arising from purchases of goods, services, or materials pursuant to the public works contract or the subcontract. This assignment shall be

made and become effective at the time the awarding body tenders final payment to CONTRACTOR, without further acknowledgment by the parties.

ARTICLE III: Compensation

A. CONTRACTOR agrees to receive and accept the prices set forth in the Bid Proposal and Bid Schedule as full compensation for furnishing all materials, performing all work, and fulfilling all obligations hereunder. In no event shall the total compensation and costs payable to CONTRACTOR under this Agreement exceed the sum of \$166,163.70 (One Hundred Sixty, Six Thousand One Hundred Sixty Three Dollars and Seventy Cents) unless specifically approved in advance and in writing by AGENCY.

Such compensation shall cover all expenses, losses, damages, and consequences arising out of the nature of the work during its progress or prior to its acceptance including those for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof in the manner and time specified in the aforesaid Contract Documents; and also including those arising from actions of the elements, unforeseen difficulties or obstructions encountered in the prosecution of the work, suspension or discontinuance of the work, and all other unknowns or risks of any description connected with the work.

B. This AGREEMENT is subject to the provisions of Article 1.7 (commencing at Section 20104.50) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding prompt payment of CONTRACTORs by local governments. Article 1.7 mandates certain procedures for the payment of undisputed and properly submitted payment requests within 30 days after receipt, for the review of payment requests, for notice to CONTRACTOR of improper payment requests, and provides for the payment of interest on progress payment requests which are not timely made in accordance with that Article. This AGREEMENT hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.7 as though fully set forth herein.

C. At the request and expense of CONTRACTOR, securities equivalent to the amount withheld shall be deposited with AGENCY, or with a state or federally chartered bank in this state as the escrow agent, who shall then pay those moneys to CONTRACTOR upon AGENCY's confirmation of CONTRACTOR'S satisfactory completion of this AGREEMENT. At any time during the term of this AGREEMENT CONTRACTOR may, at its own expense, substitute securities for funds otherwise withheld as retention (or the retained percentage) in accordance with Public Contract Code § 22300.

ARTICLE IV: Labor Code

AGENCY and CONTRACTOR acknowledge that this AGREEMENT is subject to the provisions of Division 2, Part 7, Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 1720) of the California Labor Code relating to public works and public agencies and agree to be bound by all the provisions thereof as though set forth fully herein. Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of the Labor Code and with other Federal, State and local laws related to labor, and rules, regulations and ordinances which apply to any work performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT is included in the price for all contract items of work involved.

This AGREEMENT is further subject to prevailing wage law, including, but not limited to, the following:

A. The CONTRACTOR shall pay the prevailing wage rates for all work performed under the AGREEMENT. When any craft or classification is omitted from the general prevailing wage determinations, the CONTRACTOR shall pay the wage rate of the craft or classification most closely related to the omitted classification. The CONTRACTOR shall forfeit as a penalty to AGENCY \$200.00 or any greater penalty provided in the Labor Code for each Calendar Day, or portion thereof, for each worker paid less than the prevailing wage rates for any work done under the AGREEMENT in violation of the provisions of the Labor Code whether such worker is employed in the execution of the work by CONTRACTOR or by any Subcontractor under CONTRACTOR. In addition, CONTRACTOR shall pay each worker the difference between such prevailing wage rates and the amount paid to each worker for each Calendar Day, or portion thereof, for which each worker was paid less than the prevailing wage rate.

- B. CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions of Labor Code Section 1777.5 concerning the employment of apprentices on public works projects, and further agrees that CONTRACTOR is responsible for compliance with Section 1777.5 by all of its subcontractors.
- C. Pursuant to Labor Code § 1725.5, CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor must be registered with the California Department of Industrial Relations for any bid proposal submitted on or after March 1, 2015, and for any contract for public work entered into on or after April 1, 2015. Further, this project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.
- D. Pursuant to Labor Code § 1776, CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor shall keep accurate payroll records, showing the name, address, social security number, work classification, straight time and overtime hours worked each day and week, and the actual per diem wages paid to each journeyman, apprentice, worker, or other employee employed by him or her in connection with this AGREEMENT. Each payroll record shall contain or be verified by a written declaration that it is made under penalty of perjury, stating both of the following: (1) The information contained in the payroll record is true and correct; and (2) The employer has complied with the requirements of Labor Code §§ 1811, and 1815 for any work performed by his or her employees on the public works project. The payroll records enumerated under subdivision (a) shall be certified and shall be available for inspection at all reasonable hours as required by Labor Code § 1776.

E. This AGREEMENT is further subject to 8-hour work day and wage and hour penalty law, including, but not limited to, Labor Code Sections 1810 and 1813, as well as California nondiscrimination laws, as follows:

CONTRACTOR shall strictly adhere to the provisions of the Labor Code regarding the 8-hour day and the 40-hour week, overtime, Saturday, Sunday and holiday work and nondiscrimination on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex or sexual orientation, except as provided in Section 12940 of the Government Code. Pursuant to the provisions of the Labor Code, eight hours' labor shall constitute a legal day's work. Work performed by CONTRACTOR's employees in excess of eight hours per day, and 40 hours during any one week, must include compensation for all hours worked in excess of eight hours per day, or 40 hours during any one week, at not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay. CONTRACTOR shall forfeit as a penalty to AGENCY \$25.00 or any greater penalty set forth in the Labor Code for each worker employed in the execution of the work by CONTRACTOR or by any Subcontractor of CONTRACTOR, for each Calendar Day during which such worker is required or permitted to the work more than eight hours in one Calendar Day or more than 40 hours in any one calendar week in violation of the Labor Code.

F. This AGREEMENT is subject to Public Contract Code Section 6109: CONTRACTOR shall be prohibited from performing work on this project with a subcontractor who is ineligible to perform work on the project pursuant to Sections 1777.1 or 1777.7 of the Labor Code.

ARTICLE V: Work Site Conditions

A. In compliance with and pursuant to Government Code Section 4215, AGENCY shall assume the responsibility, as between the parties to this AGREEMENT, for the timely removal, relocation, or protection of existing main- or trunk-line utility facilities located on the site of any construction project that is a subject of this AGREEMENT, if such utilities are not identified by AGENCY in the plans and specifications made a part of the invitation for bids. The Contract Documents shall include provisions to compensate CONTRACTOR for the costs of locating, repairing damage not due to the failure of CONTRACTOR to exercise reasonable care, and removing or relocating such utility facilities not indicated in the plans and specifications with reasonable accuracy, and for equipment on the project necessarily idled during such work. CONTRACTOR shall not be assessed liquidated damages for delay in completion of the project, when such delay was caused by the failure of AGENCY or the owner of a utility to provide for removal or relocation of such utility facilities.

B. To the extent that the work requires trenches in excess of five feet (5') and is estimated to cost more than \$25,000, prior to any excavation, CONTRACTOR must provide the AGENCY, or a registered civil or structural engineer employed by the AGENCY to whom authority has been delegated to accept such plans, a detailed plan showing the design of shoring, bracing, sloping, or other provisions to be made for worker protection from the hazard of caving ground during the excavation of such trench or trenches. If such plan varies from the shoring system standards, the plan shall be prepared by a registered civil or structural engineer. Nothing in this section shall be

deemed to allow the use of a shoring, sloping, or protective system less effective than that required by the Construction Safety Orders.

C. This AGREEMENT is further subject to Public Contract Code Section 7104 with regard to any trenches deeper than four feet (4') involved in the proposed work as follows:

CONTRACTOR shall promptly, and before the following conditions are disturbed, notify AGENCY, in writing, of any:

- (1) Material that CONTRACTOR believes may be hazardous waste, as defined in Section 25117 of the Health and Safety Code, which is required to be removed to a Class I, Class II, or Class III disposal site in accordance with existing law.
- (2) Subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site differing from those indicated by all available information provided prior to the deadline for submission of bids.
- (3) Unknown physical conditions at the site of any unusual nature, different materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the contract.

AGENCY shall promptly investigate the conditions, and if it finds that the conditions do materially so differ, or involve hazardous waste, and cause a decrease or increase in CONTRACTOR's cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of the work, AGENCY shall issue a change order under the procedures described in this AGREEMENT.

In the event that a dispute arises between AGENCY and CONTRACTOR whether the conditions materially differ, or involve hazardous waste, or cause a decrease or increase in CONTRACTOR's cost of, or time required for, performance of any part of the work, CONTRACTOR shall not be excused from any scheduled completion date provided in the AGREEMENT, but shall proceed with all work to be performed under the AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall retain any and all rights provided either by contract or by law which pertain to the resolution of disputes and protests between the contracting parties.

ARTICLE VI: Insurance

A. With respect to performance of work under this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR shall maintain, and shall require all of its subcontractors to maintain, insurance as required by Section E "Standard Specifications" of the Contract Documents.

B. This AGREEMENT is further subject to Workers' Compensation obligations, including, but not limited to, California Labor Code Sections 1860 and 1861 as follows:

CONTRACTOR shall take out and maintain, during the life of this contract, Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of CONTRACTOR's employees employed at the site of improvement; and, if any work is sublet, CONTRACTOR shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR

and any of CONTRACTOR's subcontractors shall be required to provide AGENCY with a written statement acknowledging its obligation to secure payment of Worker's Compensation Insurance as required by Labor Code § 1861; to wit: 'I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.' If any class of employees engaged in work under this AGREEMENT at the site of the Project is not protected under any Worker's Compensation law, CONTRACTOR shall provide and shall cause each subcontractor to provide adequate insurance for the protection of employees not otherwise protected. CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless AGENCY for any damage resulting from failure of either CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor to take out or maintain such insurance.

ARTICLE VII: Indemnification

To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR shall, at its sole cost and expense, fully defend, indemnify and hold harmless AGENCY, its authorized representatives and their respective subsidiaries, affiliates, members, directors, officers, employees and agents (collectively, the "Indemnitees") from and against any and all claims, actions, demands, costs, judgments, liens, penalties, liabilities, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to any fees of accountants, attorneys or other professionals (collectively "Liabilities"), arising out of, in connection with, resulting from or related to, any act, omission, fault or negligence of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's Representative, or any of its officers, agents, employees, Subcontractors or Suppliers, or any person or organization directly or indirectly employed by any of them (Collectively, the "Indemnitors"), in connection with or relating to or claimed to be in connection with or relating to the work performed under this AGREEMENT.

If CONTRACTOR is a joint venture or partnership, each venturer or partner shall be jointly and severally liable for any and all of the duties and obligations of CONTRACTOR that are assumed under or arise out of this AGREEMENT. Each of such venturers or partners waives notice of the breach or non-performance of any undertaking or obligation of CONTRACTOR contained in, resulting from or assumed under this AGREEMENT, and the failure to give any such notice shall not affect or impair such venturer's or partner's joint and several liability hereunder.

ARTICLE VIII: Binding Effect

AGENCY and CONTRACTOR each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto and to its partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect of all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents. This AGREEMENT is not assignable nor the performance of either party's duties delegable without the prior written consent of the other party. Any attempted or purported assignment or delegation of any of the rights of obligations of either party without the prior written consent of the other shall be void and of no force and effect.

ARTICLE IX: Dispute Resolution

A. Any court action arising out of this AGREEMENT shall be filed in the Los Angeles County Superior Court. Any alternative dispute resolution proceeding arising out of this AGREEMENT shall be heard in the County of Los Angeles.

B. AGENCY shall have full authority to compromise or otherwise settle any claim relating to this AGREEMENT or any part hereof at any time. AGENCY shall provide timely notification to CONTRACTOR of the receipt of any third-party claim relating to this AGREEMENT. AGENCY shall be entitled to recover its reasonable costs incurred in providing the notification required by this section.

C. This AGREEMENT is further subject to the provisions of Article 1.5 (commencing at Section 20104) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding the resolution of public works claims of less than \$375,000. Article 1.5 mandates certain procedures for the filing of claims and supporting documentation by CONTRACTOR, for the response to such claims by the AGENCY, for a mandatory meet and confer conference upon the request of CONTRACTOR, for mandatory nonbinding mediation in the event litigation is commenced, and for mandatory judicial arbitration upon the parties' failure to resolve the dispute through mediation. This AGREEMENT hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.5 as though fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE X: Independent CONTRACTOR

CONTRACTOR is and shall at all times remain as to AGENCY, a wholly independent CONTRACTOR. Neither AGENCY nor any of its agents shall have control of the conduct of CONTRACTOR or any of CONTRACTOR's employees, except as herein set forth. CONTRACTOR shall not at any time or in any manner represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner agents or employees of AGENCY.

ARTICLE XI: Taxes

CONTRACTOR is responsible for paying all retail, sales and use, transportation, export, import, special or other taxes and duties applicable to, and assessable against any work, materials, equipment, services, processes and operations incidental to or involved in this AGREEMENT. The CONTRACTOR is responsible for ascertaining and arranging to pay such taxes and duties. The prices established in this AGREEMENT shall include compensation for any taxes the CONTRACTOR is required to pay by laws and regulations in effect as of the execution of this AGREEMENT.

ARTICLE XII: Notices

All notices and communications shall be sent in writing to the parties at the following addresses:

ARTICLE XIII: Entire Agreement

This AGREEMENT supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or written, between the parties and contains all of the covenants and agreements between the parties pertaining to the work of improvements described herein. Each party to this AGREEMENT acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party, or anyone acting on behalf of any party, which are not embodied herein, and that any other agreement, statement or promise not contained in this AGREEMENT shall not be valid or binding. Any modification of this AGREEMENT will be effective only if signed by the party to be charged.

The benefits and obligations of this AGREEMENT shall inure to and be binding upon the representatives, agents, partners, heirs, successors and assigns of the parties hereto. This AGREEMENT shall be construed pursuant to the laws of the State of California.

ARTICLE XIV: Authority to Contract

The signatories hereto represent that they are authorized to sign on behalf of the respective parties they represent and are competent to do so, and each of the parties hereto hereby irrevocably waives any and all rights to challenge signatures on these bases.

ARTICLE XV: General Provisions

A. All reports, documents or other written material ("written products" herein) developed by CONTRACTOR in the performance of this Agreement shall be and remain the property of AGENCY without restriction or limitation upon its use or dissemination by AGENCY. CONTRACTOR may take and retain copies of such written products as desired, but no such written products shall be the subject of a copyright application by CONTRACTOR.

B. In the performance of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any employee, subcontractor, or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, age, physical or mental disability, medical condition or any other unlawful basis.

- C. The captions appearing at the commencement of the sections hereof, and in any paragraph thereof, are descriptive only and for convenience in reference to this Agreement. Should there be any conflict between such heading, and the section or paragraph at the head of which it appears, the section or paragraph hereof, as the case may be, and not such heading, shall control and govern in the construction of this Agreement. Masculine or feminine pronouns shall be substituted for the neuter form and vice versa, and the plural shall be substituted for the singular form and vice versa, in any place or places herein in which the context requires such substitution(s).
- D. The waiver by AGENCY or CONTRACTOR of any breach of any term, covenant or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant or condition or of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant or condition herein contained. No term, covenant or condition of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been waived by AGENCY or CONTRACTOR unless in writing.
- E. Each right, power and remedy provided for herein or now or hereafter existing at law, in equity, by statute, or otherwise shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other right, power, or remedy provided for herein or now or hereafter existing at law, in equity, by statute, or otherwise. The exercise, the commencement of the exercise, or the forbearance of the exercise by any party of any one or more of such rights, powers or remedies shall not preclude the simultaneous or later exercise by such party of any of all of such other rights, powers or remedies.
- F. CONTRACTOR shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for services or expenditures and disbursements charged to AGENCY under this Agreement for a minimum of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to CONTRACTOR under this Agreement. All such documents shall be made available for inspection, audit, and/or copying at any time during regular business hours, upon oral or written request of AGENCY. In addition, pursuant to Government Code Section 8546.7, if the amount of public funds expended under this Agreement exceeds ten thousand dollars, all such documents and this Agreement shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of AGENCY or as part of any audit of AGENCY, for a period of three (3) years after final payment under the Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties hereto for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns do hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants herein contained and have caused this AGREEMENT to be executed in duplicate by setting hereunto their names, titles, hands, and seals this 27th day of September, 2017.

In case suit is brought upon this bond, SURETY will pay reasonable attorneys' fees to the plaintiffs and AGENCY in an amount to be fixed by the court.

This bond shall inure to the benefit to any of the persons named in Civil Code Section 9100 as to give a right of action to such persons or their assigns in any suit brought upon this bond.

The SURETY hereby stipulates and agrees that no change, extension of time, alteration or addition to the terms of the contract or the specifications accompanying it shall in any manner affect SURETY's obligations on this bond. The SURETY hereby waives notice of any such change, extension, alteration or addition and hereby waives the requirements of Section 2845 of the Civil Code as a condition precedent to any remedies AGENCY may have.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approving the execution of Cooperation Agreement Number 1 with the Los Angeles Urban County CDBG Program for the next three-year funding cycle, effective July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2018.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

Every three (3) years, the Community Development Commission of the County of Los Angeles (CDC) must re-quality with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for entitlement status as an Urban County in order to participate in the CDBG Program. The CDC submitted the documentation for requalification to HUD for the entitlement designation on July 12, 2017. The CDC received correspondence from HUD's new Legal Counsel indicating that it will be necessary to request an Amendment to the Cooperation Agreement from CDBG participating cities that clearly includes the following provision: "A unit of general local government may not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer all or any portion of such funds to another such metropolitan city, urban county, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe, or insular area that directly or indirectly received CDBG funds in exchange for any other funds, credits, or non-Federal consideration, but

must use such funds for activities eligible under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974." Although participating cities signed certifications in 2014 prohibiting the sale trade, or otherwise transfer of CDBG funds, that language is not adequate per the review by HUD's new Legal Counsel. The CDC requests that the City sign an Amendment to the Cooperation Agreement incorporating the language as noted above.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

None.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Approve continued participation in the Los Angeles Urban County Community Development Block Grant Program by authorizing the Mayor, or his Designee, and the City Attorney to sign four (4) copies of Cooperation Agreement Amendment Number 1 with the County of Los Angeles, and return them to the CDC by the morning of September 28, 2017.



CITY'S CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE LOS ANGELES URBAN COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

As you may be aware, every three (3) years, the County of Los Angeles must re-qualify with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for entitlement status as an Urban County so that we can participate in the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. We submitted the documentation for re-qualification to HUD for the entitlement designation on July 12, 2017.

The County's re-qualification package has been under review by HUD's new Legal Counsel and we recently received correspondence from them indicating that it will be necessary to request an Amendment to the Cooperation Agreement from our CDBG participating cities clearly stating the following: "A unit of general local government may not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer all or any portion of such funds to another such metropolitan city, urban county, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe, or insular area that directly or indirectly receives CDBG funds in exchange for any other funds, credits, or non-Federal considerations, but must use such funds for activities eligible under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974." Although participating cities signed certifications in 2014 prohibiting the sale, trade, or otherwise transfer of CDBG funds, apparently the language is not adequate per the review by HUD's new Legal Counsel, so we will need to ask the City to sign an Amendment to the Cooperation Agreement. HUD has requested that we use the language found in the Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development Appropriations Act, 2014.

Enclosed are four (4) copies of the Amendment to the Cooperation Agreement. Please have each copy signed by the appropriate City officials and returned to us by no later than September 15, 2017. We recognize that many of you are accustomed to signing our contracts digitally, however, this process will be manual. We did not automate these Agreements because they are not required annually. Please do not type or print the date on the first page. The date will be entered on the day that the Executive Director of the Community Development Commission

signs the Agreement. Once we submit our amended package to HUD, we will have the new Amendments posted to the CDBG Online System for the City to access, if it wishes to do so. It will be filed with your other contracts and Cooperation Agreement.

We look forward to being able to fund programs and services for those communities most in need and to your continued participation in the CDBG Program. Please remember that we need the signed Amendments returned to us by no later than September 15, 2017. This process is calendar driven and HUD needs the information to determine who the Urban Counties/Grantees are going to be for Fiscal Year 2018, for financial allocation purposes. If this due date is not feasible, please notify us immediately.

THIS AMENDMENT NUMBER 1 TO THE COOPERATION AGREEMENT which was effective July 1, 2015, is made this ____ day of _____ by and between the County of Los Angeles, hereinafter called the "County," acting by and through the Community Development Commission of the County of Los Angeles (Commission) and the City of Calabasas (City).

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, in 1974, the U.S. Congress enacted and the President signed a law entitled, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, herein called the "Act:"

WHEREAS, the County and City desire to cooperate to undertake, or assist in undertaking, community development, community renewal of lower income housing assistance activities, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing, including, but not limited to, the improvement or development of housing for persons of low- to moderate-incomes, and other community or urban renewal activities authorized by the Act, the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (NAHA), and the U.S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended;

WHEREAS, the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, the HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program, and the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program are required to have an approved comprehensive housing strategy as authorized under NAHA:

WHEREAS, the County has requested of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, hereinafter referred to as "HUD," that the County be designated as an "Urban County;"

WHEREAS, the County and the Participating City previously entered into a Cooperation Agreement;

WHEREAS, the City desires to participate with the County in said program;

WHEREAS, as the Urban County designee, the County will take responsibility and assume all obligations of an applicant under federal statutes including: the analysis of needs, the setting of objectives, the development of community development and housing assistance plans, the consolidated plan, and the assurances of certifications; and

WHEREAS, the terms and provisions of this Agreement are fully authorized under State and local law, and this Agreement provides full legal authority for the County, by and through its agents and instrumentalities including the Housing Authority of the County of Los Angeles and the Community Development Commission of the County of Los Angeles, herein referred to as "County," to undertake, or assist in undertaking, essential community development and housing assistance activities, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein set forth and the mutual benefits to be derived there from, the parties agree as follows:

The City may not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer all or any portion of CDBG funds at another metropolitan city, urban county, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe, or insular area that directly or indirectly receives CDBG funds in exchange for any other funds, credits, or non-Federal consideration, but must use such funds for activities eligible under Title I of the Housing and Community Act of 1974.

This Amendment Number 1 amends the original Cooperation Agreement to reflect the additions and/or change(s) noted above, and this section(s) should be substituted in its entirety or added to the previously executed Agreement. All other terms and conditions of said Agreement shall remain the same.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation to approve a professional services agreement to Vandergeest Landscape Care, Inc. for Public Works Maintenance Areas for regular monthly landscape maintenance of city public works street medians, certain sidewalks, parkways and freeway interchanges in the amount not to exceed \$80,000.00.

BACKGROUND:

VanderGeest Landscape Care, Inc. is the City's current contractor for Public Works Maintenance Areas, formally Public Works Maintenance Zone Area #1 and Public Works Maintenance Zone Area #2. This contract was for two (2) years and expires February 14, 2018. Staff is requesting \$80,000.00 to fund the remainder of FY 2017-18, and through the expiration of the contract in FY 2017-18 for regularly scheduled monthly maintenance plus CPI increase and required extra work.

ValleyCrest Landscape Maintenance was the contractor for Public Works Maintenance Zone Area #2 prior to declining a contract extension; therefore Vandergeest Landscape Care, Inc. accepted adding the landscape maintenance of Public Works Maintenance Zone Area #2 at the current contract price with CPI increase. Vandergeest Landscape Care, Inc. is now the current contractor for the Public Works Maintenance Areas.

In addition, the Public Works Maintenance Areas added two new locations from recently completed Capital Improvement Projects: Mulholland Highway Scenic Corridor Phase III Project 4 and 14 Las Virgenes Rd Scenic Corridor Completion Project. Both project contributed over 20 landscaped medians and planters to the Public Works Maintenance Areas, requiring more monthly maintenance.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

This existing contract is for two (2) years and expires on February 14, 2018. The contract will include Public Works Maintenance Areas and has increased work scope from newly constructed landscaped medians and planters.

The existing contract amount has been expended due to the costs the additional areas requiring monthly maintenance have generated. An additional Professional Service Agreement of \$75,000 is required to fulfill the monthly maintenance until the contract expiration date of February 14, 2018.

The Public Works Maintenance Areas will be advertised to include the existing and new areas in the new proposal documents. The request for proposal procedure will be expedited to ensure responses are received as soon as possible and a contractor is selected in time to take over the Public Works Maintenance Areas as soon as the current Professional Services Agreement expires.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT Providing for Payment of Prevailing Wages

(City of Calabasas/ Vandergeest Landscape Care, Inc.)

1. <u>IDENTIFICATION</u>

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Calabasas, a California municipal corporation ("City"), and **Vandergeest Landscape Care, Inc.** a *California Corporation* ("Consultant").

2. RECITALS

- 2.1 City has determined that it requires the following professional services from a consultant: Landscape Maintenance of the Public Works Maintenance Areas within the City of Calabasas.
- 2.2 Consultant represents that it is fully qualified to perform such professional services by virtue of its experience and the training, education and expertise of its principals and employees. Consultant further represents that it is willing to accept responsibility for performing such services in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained, City and Consultant agree as follows:

3. **DEFINITIONS**

- 3.1 "Scope of Services": Such professional services as are set forth in Consultant's *February 2016* proposal to City attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 3.2 "Approved Fee Schedule": Such compensation rates as are set forth in Consultant's *February 2016* fee schedule to City attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference.

3.3	"Commencement Date": _	<u>September 28, 2017</u> .
3.4	"Expiration Date":	February 14, 2018

4. TERM

The term of this Agreement shall commence at 12:00 a.m. on the Commencement Date and shall expire at 11:59 p.m. on the Expiration Date unless extended by written agreement of the parties or terminated earlier in accordance with Section 17 ("Termination") below.

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5. <u>CONSULTANT'S SERVICES</u>

- 5.1 Consultant shall perform the services identified in the Scope of Services. City shall have the right to request, in writing, changes in the Scope of Services. Any such changes mutually agreed upon by the parties, and any corresponding increase or decrease in compensation, shall be incorporated by written amendment to this Agreement. In no event shall the total compensation and costs payable to Consultant under this Agreement exceed the sum of **Eighty Thousand** Dollars (\$80,000.00) unless specifically approved in advance and in writing by City.
- 5.2 Consultant shall perform all work to the highest professional standards of Consultant's profession and in a manner reasonably satisfactory to City. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, including the conflict of interest provisions of Government Code Section 1090 and the Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000 et seq.).
- During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall not perform any work for another person or entity for whom Consultant was not working at the Commencement Date if both (i) such work would require Consultant to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute and (ii) City has not consented in writing to Consultant's performance of such work.
- Consultant represents that it has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required to perform the services identified in the Scope of Services. All such services shall be performed by Consultant or under its supervision, and all personnel engaged in the work shall be qualified to perform such services.

 Joanne Vandergeest shall be Consultant's project administrator and shall have direct responsibility for management of Consultant's performance under this Agreement. No change shall be made in Consultant's project administrator without City's prior written consent.
- 5.5 To the extent that the Scope of Services involves trenches deeper than 4', Contractor shall promptly, and before the following conditions are disturbed, notify the City, in writing, of any:
 - (1) Material that the contractor believes may be material that is hazardous waste, as defined in § 25117 of the Health and Safety Code, which is required to be removed to a Class I, Class II, or Class III disposal site in accordance with provisions of existing law.
 - (2) Subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site differing from those indicated by information about the site made available to bidders prior to

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the deadline for submitting bids.

(3) Unknown physical conditions at the site of any unusual nature, different materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the contract.

City shall promptly investigate the conditions, and if it finds that the conditions do materially so differ, or involve hazardous waste, and cause a decrease or increase in the contractor's cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of the work, the City shall issue a change order under the procedures described in the contract.

6. **COMPENSATION**

- 6.1 City agrees to compensate Consultant for the services provided under this Agreement, and Consultant agrees to accept in full satisfaction for such services, payment in accordance with the Approved Fee Schedule.
- 6.2 Consultant shall submit to City an invoice, on a monthly basis or less frequently, for the services performed pursuant to this Agreement. Each invoice shall itemize the services rendered during the billing period and the amount due. Within thirty calendar days of receipt of each invoice, City shall pay all undisputed amounts included on the invoice. City shall not withhold applicable taxes or other authorized deductions from payments made to Consultant.
- 6.3 Payments for any services requested by City and not included in the Scope of Services shall be made to Consultant by City on a time-and-materials basis using Consultant's standard fee schedule. Consultant shall be entitled to increase the fees in this fee schedule at such time as it increases its fees for its clients generally; provided, however, in no event shall Consultant be entitled to increase fees for services rendered before the thirtieth day after Consultant notifies City in writing of an increase in that fee schedule. Fees for such additional services shall be paid within sixty days of the date Consultant issues an invoice to City for such services.
- 6.4 This Agreement is further subject to the provisions of Article 1.7 (commencing at Section 20104.50) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding prompt payment of contractors by local governments. Article 1.7 mandates certain procedures for the payment of undisputed and properly submitted payment requests within 30 days after receipt, for the review of payment requests, for notice to the contractor of improper payment requests, and provides for the payment of interest on progress payment requests which are not timely made in accordance with this Article. This Agreement hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.7 as though fully set forth herein.

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6.5 To the extent applicable, at any time during the term of the Agreement, the Consultant may at its own expense, substitute securities equivalent to the amount withheld as retention (or the retained percentage) in accordance with Public Contract Code section 22300. At the request and expense of the consultant, securities equivalent to the amount withheld shall be deposited with the public agency, or with a state or federally chartered bank in this state as the escrow agent, who shall then pay those moneys to the Consultant. Upon satisfactory completion of the contract, the securities shall be returned to the Consultant.

7. OWNERSHIP OF WRITTEN PRODUCTS

All reports, documents or other written material ("written products" herein) developed by Consultant in the performance of this Agreement shall be and remain the property of City without restriction or limitation upon its use or dissemination by City. Consultant may take and retain copies of such written products as desired, but no such written products shall be the subject of a copyright application by Consultant.

8. <u>RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES</u>

Consultant is, and shall at all times remain as to City, a wholly independent contractor. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise to act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not represent that it is, or that any of its agents or employees are, in any manner employees of City.

9. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY</u>

All data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without prior written consent by City. City shall grant such consent if disclosure is legally required. Upon request, all City data shall be returned to City upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

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10. **INDEMNIFICATION**

- 10.1 The parties agree that City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers should, to the fullest extent permitted by law, be protected from any and all loss, injury, damage, claim, lawsuit, cost, expense, attorneys' fees, litigation costs, or any other cost arising out of or in any way related to the performance of this Agreement. Accordingly, the provisions of this indemnity provision are intended by the parties to be interpreted and construed to provide the City with the fullest protection possible under the law. Consultant acknowledges that City would not enter into this Agreement in the absence of Consultant's commitment to indemnify and protect City as set forth herein.
- 10.2 To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims and losses, costs or expenses for any damage due to death or injury to any person and injury to any property resulting from any alleged intentional, reckless, negligent, or otherwise wrongful acts, errors or omissions of Consultant or any of its officers, employees, servants, agents, or subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement. Such costs and expenses shall include reasonable attorneys' fees due to counsel of City's choice.
- 10.3 City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any compensation due Consultant under this Agreement any amount due City from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to pay City promptly any indemnification arising under this Section 10 and related to Consultant's failure to either (i) pay taxes on amounts received pursuant to this Agreement or (ii) comply with applicable workers' compensation laws.
- 10.4 The obligations of Consultant under this Section 10 will not be limited by the provisions of any workers' compensation act or similar act. Consultant expressly waives its statutory immunity under such statutes or laws as to City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers.
- 10.5 Consultant agrees to obtain executed indemnity agreements with provisions identical to those set forth here in this Section 10 from each and every subcontractor or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. In the event Consultant fails to obtain such indemnity obligations from others as required herein, Consultant agrees to be fully responsible and indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims and losses, costs or expenses for any damage due to death or injury to any person and injury to any property resulting from any alleged intentional, reckless, negligent, or otherwise wrongful acts, errors or omissions of Consultant's subcontractors or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of

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Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. Such costs and expenses shall include reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by counsel of City's choice.

10.6 City does not, and shall not, waive any rights that it may possess against Consultant because of the acceptance by City, or the deposit with City, of any insurance policy or certificate required pursuant to this Agreement. This hold harmless and indemnification provision shall apply regardless of whether or not any insurance policies are determined to be applicable to the claim, demand, damage, liability, loss, cost or expense.

11. <u>INSURANCE</u>

- During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall carry, maintain, and keep in full force and effect insurance against claims for death or injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with Consultant's performance of this Agreement. Such insurance shall be of the types and in the amounts as set forth below:
 - 11.1.1 Comprehensive General Liability Insurance with coverage limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) including products and operations hazard, contractual insurance, broad form property damage, independent consultants, personal injury, underground hazard, and explosion and collapse hazard where applicable.
 - 11.1.2 Automobile Liability Insurance for vehicles used in connection with the performance of this Agreement with minimum limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claimant and One Million dollars (\$1,000,000) per incident.
 - 11.1.3 Worker's Compensation insurance as required by the laws of the State of California, including but not limited to California Labor Code § 1860 and 1861 as follows:

Contractor shall take out and maintain, during the life of this contract, Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of Contractor's employees employed at the site of improvement; and, if any work is sublet, Contractor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by Contractor. Contractor and any of Contractor's subcontractors shall be required to provide City with a written statement acknowledging its obligation to secure payment of Worker's Compensation Insurance as required by Labor Code § 1861; to wit: 'I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against

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liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.' If any class of employees engaged in work under this contract at the site of the Project is not protected under any Worker's Compensation law, Contractor shall provide and shall cause each subcontractor to provide adequate insurance for the protection of employees not otherwise protected. Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless City for any damage resulting from failure of either Contractor or any subcontractor to take out or maintain such insurance.

- 11.2 Consultant shall require each of its subcontractors to maintain insurance coverage that meets all of the requirements of this Agreement.
- 11.3 The policy or policies required by this Agreement shall be issued by an insurer admitted in the State of California and with a rating of at least A:VII in the latest edition of Best's Insurance Guide.
- 11.4 Consultant agrees that if it does not keep the aforesaid insurance in full force and effect, City may either (i) immediately terminate this Agreement; or (ii) take out the necessary insurance and pay, at Consultant's expense, the premium thereon.
- 11.5 At all times during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall maintain on file with City's Risk Manager a certificate or certificates of insurance showing that the aforesaid policies are in effect in the required amounts and naming the City and its officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds. Consultant shall, prior to commencement of work under this Agreement, file with City's Risk Manager such certificate(s).
- 11.6 Consultant shall provide proof that policies of insurance required herein expiring during the term of this Agreement have been renewed or replaced with other policies providing at least the same coverage. Such proof will be furnished at least two weeks prior to the expiration of the coverages.
- 11.7 The General Liability Policy of insurance required by this Agreement shall contain an endorsement naming City and its officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds. The General Liability Policy required under this Agreement shall contain an endorsement providing that the policies cannot be canceled or reduced except on thirty days' prior written notice to City. Consultant agrees to require its insurer to modify the certificates of insurance to delete any exculpatory wording stating that failure of the insurer to mail written notice of cancellation imposes no obligation, and to delete the word "endeavor" with regard to any notice provisions.

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- 11.8 The insurance provided by Consultant shall be primary to any coverage available to City. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by City and/or its officers, employees, agents or volunteers, shall be in excess of Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 11.9 All insurance coverage provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not prohibit Consultant, and Consultant's employees, agents or subcontractors, from waiving the right of subrogation prior to a loss. Consultant hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the City.
- 11.10 Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. At the option of City, Consultant shall either reduce or eliminate the deductibles or self-insured retentions with respect to City, or Consultant shall procure a bond or other security acceptable to the City guaranteeing payment of losses and expenses.
- 11.11 Procurement of insurance by Consultant shall not be construed as a limitation of Consultant's liability or as full performance of Consultant's duties to indemnify, hold harmless and defend under Section 10 of this Agreement.

12. <u>MUTUAL COOPERATION</u>

- 12.1 City shall provide Consultant with all pertinent data, documents and other requested information as is reasonably available for the proper performance of Consultant's services under this Agreement.
- 12.2 In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance in connection with this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance that City may require.

13. RECORDS AND INSPECTIONS

Consultant shall maintain full and accurate records with respect to all matters covered under this Agreement for a period of three years after the expiration or termination of this Agreement. City shall have the right to access and examine such records, without charge, during normal business hours. City shall further have the right to audit such records, to make transcripts therefrom and to inspect all program data, documents, proceedings, and activities with respect to this Agreement.

14. PERMITS AND APPROVALS

Consultant shall obtain, at its sole cost and expense, all permits and regulatory approvals necessary in the performance of this Agreement. This includes, but shall not be limited to, encroachment permits and building and safety permits and inspections.

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15. NOTICES

Any notices, bills, invoices, or reports required by this Agreement shall be deemed received on: (i) the day of delivery if delivered by hand, facsimile or overnight courier service during the addressee's regular business hours; or (ii) on the third business day following deposit in the United States mail if delivered by mail, postage prepaid, to the addresses listed below (or to such other addresses as the parties may, from time to time, designate in writing).

16. <u>SURVIVING COVENANTS</u>

The parties agree that the covenants contained in Section 9, Section 10, Paragraph 12.2 and Section 13 of this Agreement shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

17. <u>TERMINATION</u>

- 17.1. City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement for any reason on five calendar days' written notice to Consultant. Consultant shall have the right to terminate this Agreement for any reason on sixty calendar days' written notice to City. Consultant agrees to cease all work under this Agreement on or before the effective date of any notice of termination. All City data, documents, objects, materials or other tangible things shall be returned to City upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement.
- 17.2 If City terminates this Agreement due to no fault or failure of performance by Consultant, then Consultant shall be paid based on the work satisfactorily

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performed at the time of termination. In no event shall Consultant be entitled to receive more than the amount that would be paid to Consultant for the full performance of the services required by this Agreement.

18. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 18.1 Consultant shall not delegate, transfer, subcontract or assign its duties or rights hereunder, either in whole or in part, without City's prior written consent, and any attempt to do so shall be void and of no effect. City shall not be obligated or liable under this Agreement to any party other than Consultant.
- 18.2 In the performance of this Agreement, Consultant shall not discriminate against any employee, subcontractor, or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, age, physical or mental disability, medical condition or any other unlawful basis.
- 18.3 The captions appearing at the commencement of the sections hereof, and in any paragraph thereof, are descriptive only and for convenience in reference to this Agreement. Should there be any conflict between such heading, and the section or paragraph thereof at the head of which it appears, the section or paragraph thereof, as the case may be, and not such heading, shall control and govern in the construction of this Agreement. Masculine or feminine pronouns shall be substituted for the neuter form and vice versa, and the plural shall be substituted for the singular form and vice versa, in any place or places herein in which the context requires such substitution(s).
- 18.4 The waiver by City or Consultant of any breach of any term, covenant or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant or condition or of any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant or condition herein contained. No term, covenant or condition of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been waived by City or Consultant unless in writing.
- 18.5 Consultant shall not be liable for any failure to perform if Consultant presents acceptable evidence, in City's sole judgment that such failure was due to causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of Consultant.

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- 18.6 Each right, power and remedy provided for herein or now or hereafter existing at law, in equity, by statute, or otherwise shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other right, power, or remedy provided for herein or now or hereafter existing at law, in equity, by statute, or otherwise. The exercise, the commencement of the exercise, or the forbearance of the exercise by any party of any one or more of such rights, powers or remedies shall not preclude the simultaneous or later exercise by such party of any of all of such other rights, powers or remedies. In the event legal action shall be necessary to enforce any term, covenant or condition herein contained, the party prevailing in such action, whether reduced to judgment or not, shall be entitled to its reasonable and actual court costs, including accountants' fees, if any, and attorneys' fees expended in The venue for any litigation shall be Los Angeles County, such action. California.
- 18.7 If any term or provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, then such term or provision shall be amended to, and solely to, the extent necessary to cure such invalidity or unenforceability, and shall be enforceable in its amended form. In such event, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 18.8 This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 18.9 All documents referenced as exhibits in this Agreement are hereby incorporated into this Agreement. In the event of any material discrepancy between the express provisions of this Agreement and the provisions of any document incorporated herein by reference, the provisions of this Agreement shall prevail. This instrument contains the entire Agreement between City and Consultant with respect to the transactions contemplated herein. No other prior oral or written agreements are binding upon the parties. Amendments hereto or deviations herefrom shall be effective and binding only if made in writing and executed by City and Consultant.

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- 18.10 This Agreement is further subject to the provisions of Article 1.5 (commencing at Section 20104) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding the resolution of public works claims of less than \$375,000. Article 1.5 mandates certain procedures for the filing of claims and supporting documentation by the contractor, for the response to such claims by the contracting public agency, for a mandatory meet and confer conference upon the request of the contractor, for mandatory nonbinding mediation in the event litigation is commenced, and for mandatory judicial arbitration upon the failure to resolve the dispute through mediation. This Agreement hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.5 as though fully set forth herein.
- 18.11 This Agreement is further subject to the provisions of California Public Contracts Code § 6109 which prohibits the Consultant from performing work on this project with a subcontractor who is ineligible to perform work on the project pursuant to §§ 1777.1 or 1777.7 of the Labor Code.

19 **PREVAILING WAGES**

- 19.1 To the extent that the estimated amount of this Agreement exceeds \$1,000, this Agreement is subject to prevailing wage law, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - 19.1.1 The Consultant shall pay the prevailing wage rates for all work performed under the Agreement. When any craft or classification is omitted from the general prevailing wage determinations, the Consultant shall pay the wage rate of the craft or classification most closely related to the omitted classification. The Consultant shall forfeit as a penalty to City \$50.00 or any greater penalty provided in the Labor Code for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each worker paid less than the prevailing wage rates for any work done under the Agreement employed in the execution of the work by Consultant or by any subcontractor of Consultant in violation of the provisions of the Labor Code. In addition, the difference between such prevailing wage rates and the amount paid to each worker for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for which each worker was paid less than the prevailing wage rate shall be paid to each worker by the Consultant.
 - 19.1.2 Consultant shall comply with the provisions of Labor Code Section 1777.5 concerning the employment of apprentices on public works projects, and further agrees that Consultant is responsible for compliance with Section 1777.5 by all of its subcontractors.
 - 19.1.3 Pursuant to Labor Code § 1776, Consultant and any subcontractor

shall keep accurate payroll records, showing the name, address, social security number, work classification, straight time and overtime hours worked each day and week, and the actual per diem wages paid to each journeyman, apprentice, worker, or other employee employed by Consultant in connection with this Agreement. Each payroll record shall contain or be verified by a written declaration that it is made under penalty of perjury, stating both of the following: (1) The information contained in the payroll record is true and correct; and (2) The employer has complied with the requirements of Labor Code §§ 1811, and 1815 for any work performed by his or her employees on the public works project. The payroll records enumerated under subdivision (a) shall be certified and shall be available for inspection at all reasonable hours as required by Labor Code § 1776.

- 19.2 To the extent that the estimated amount of this Agreement exceeds \$1,000, this Agreement is further subject to 8-hour work day and wage and hour penalty law, including, but not limited to, Labor Code Sections 1810 and 1813, as well as California nondiscrimination laws, as follows:
 - 19.2.1 Consultant shall strictly adhere to the provisions of the Labor Code regarding the 8-hour day and the 40-hour week, overtime, Saturday, Sunday and holiday work and nondiscrimination on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex or sexual orientation, except as provided in Section 12940 of the Government Code. Pursuant to the provisions of the Labor Code, eight hours' labor shall constitute a legal day's work. Work performed by Consultant's employees in excess of eight hours per day, and 40 hours during any one week, must include compensation for all hours worked in excess of eight hours per day, or 40 hours during any one week, at not less than one and onehalf times the basic rate of pay. Consultant shall forfeit as a penalty to City \$25.00 or any greater penalty set forth in the Labor Code for each worker employed in the execution of the work by Consultant or by any Subcontractor of Consultant, for each calendar day during which such worker is required or permitted to the work more than eight hours in one calendar day or more than 40 hours in any one calendar week in violation of the provisions of the Labor Code.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation to approve a three year professional services agreement to Arch Chemical Inc., dba Marine Biochemists, to provide daily Calabasas Lake maintenance services and as-needed lake equipment repair or replacement in an amount not to exceed \$497,280.00.

BACKGROUND:

Calabasas Lake is a man-made structure. It is 20 acres, has a depth of approximately 4½ feet deep, and holds approximately 20 million gallons of water when filled to capacity.

Marine Biochemists of California, which was purchased by Arch Chemicals, Inc., has been the maintenance contractor for Calabasas Lake since 1993. During this

time the only cost addition occurred during September 2005, when city staff requested the addition of weekend maintenance service.

Marine Biochemists of California continues to demonstrate the resource management skill, knowledge, expertise, and ability to manage Calabasas Lake in the manner required by the City. Because of this, the City has determined that Marine Biochemists of California is the sole-source provider, per City of Calabasas Municipal Code, Title 3, §3.40 Purchasing System, Subsection 3.40.090.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

Marine Biochemists has submitted a proposal for lake maintenance for a period of three years, at the rate of \$11,730.00 per month, or \$140,760.00 per year for lake maintenance.

In addition, costs to repair or replace lake aeration equipment are expected to remain approximately the same as prior year costs. Maintenance, repair and replacement of lake aeration equipment is billed as Time and Material (T & M). Based on past history this cost is not expected to exceed \$25,000 per year.

Yearly maintenance plus additional repairs and replacement will total \$165,760.00 per year for a contract amount not to exceed \$497,280.00 for three years.

Because of the length of time of the prior professional services agreement the city attorney recommended implementation of a new professional services agreement with Arch Chemicals / Marine Biochemists utilizing the current lake maintenance contractor as a sole source provider.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

The cost for 7 days per week, 8 hours per day lake maintenance is \$11,730 per month or \$140,760 per year. These funds come from existing budgeted Fund 326-LMD #22 Ad Valorem/CBA monies.

Maintenance, repair and replacement of lake aeration equipment is billed as Time and Material (T & M). Based on past history this cost is not expected to exceed \$25,000 per year.

The total per-year cost is \$165,760 for a total contract cost of \$497,280.00. These funds come from existing budgeted Fund 21-326-XXXX-21.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Recommendation to approve a three year professional services agreement to Arch Chemical Inc., dba Marine Biochemists, to provide daily Calabasas Lake maintenance services and as-needed lake equipment repair or replacement in an amount not to exceed \$497,280.00.

Any such changes mutually agreed upon by the parties, and any corresponding increase or decrease in compensation, shall be incorporated by written amendment to this Agreement. In no event shall the total compensation and costs payable to Consultant under this Agreement exceed the sum of Four Hundred Ninety Seven Thousand Two Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$497,280.00) unless specifically approved in advance and in writing by City.
- 5.2 Consultant shall perform all work to the highest professional standards of Consultant's profession and in a manner reasonably satisfactory to City. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, including the conflict of interest provisions of Government Code Section 1090 and the Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000 et seq.).
- During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall not perform any work for another person or entity for whom Consultant was not working at the Commencement Date if both (i) such work would require Consultant to abstain from a decision under this Agreement pursuant to a conflict of interest statute and (ii) City has not consented in writing to Consultant's performance of such work.
- 5.4 Consultant represents that it has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required to perform the services identified in the Scope of Services. All such services shall be performed by Consultant or under its supervision, and all personnel engaged in the work shall be qualified to perform such services. **Curt Cress** shall be Consultant's project administrator and shall have direct responsibility for management of Consultant's performance under this Agreement. No change shall be made in Consultant's project administrator without City's prior written consent.
- 5.5 To the extent that the Scope of Services involves trenches deeper than 4', Contractor shall promptly, and before the following conditions are disturbed, notify the City, in writing, of any:
 - (1) Material that the contractor believes may be material that is hazardous waste, as defined in § 25117 of the Health and Safety Code, which is required to be removed to a Class I, Class II, or Class III disposal site in accordance with provisions of existing law.
 - (2) Subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site differing from

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those indicated by information about the site made available to bidders prior to the deadline for submitting bids.

(3) Unknown physical conditions at the site of any unusual nature, different materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in the contract.

City shall promptly investigate the conditions, and if it finds that the conditions do materially so differ, or involve hazardous waste, and cause a decrease or increase in the contractor's cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of the work, the City shall issue a change order under the procedures described in the contract.

6. **COMPENSATION**

- 6.1 City agrees to compensate Consultant for the services provided under this Agreement, and Consultant agrees to accept in full satisfaction for such services, payment in accordance with the Approved Fee Schedule.
- 6.2 Consultant shall submit to City an invoice, on a monthly basis or less frequently, for the services performed pursuant to this Agreement. Each invoice shall itemize the services rendered during the billing period and the amount due. Within thirty calendar days of receipt of each invoice, City shall pay all undisputed amounts included on the invoice. City shall not withhold applicable taxes or other authorized deductions from payments made to Consultant.
- 6.3 Payments for any services requested by City and not included in the Scope of Services shall be made to Consultant by City on a time-and-materials basis using Consultant's standard fee schedule. Consultant shall be entitled to increase the fees in this fee schedule at such time as it increases its fees for its clients generally; provided, however, in no event shall Consultant be entitled to increase fees for services rendered before the thirtieth day after Consultant notifies City in writing of an increase in that fee schedule. Fees for such additional services shall be paid within sixty days of the date Consultant issues an invoice to City for such services.
- 6.4 This Agreement is further subject to the provisions of Article 1.7 (commencing at Section 20104.50) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding prompt payment of contractors by local governments. Article 1.7 mandates certain procedures for the payment of undisputed and properly submitted payment requests within 30 days after receipt, for the review of payment requests, for notice to the contractor of improper payment requests, and provides for the payment of interest on progress payment requests which are not timely made in

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- accordance with this Article. This Agreement hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.7 as though fully set forth herein.
- 6.5 To the extent applicable, at any time during the term of the Agreement, the Consultant may at its own expense, substitute securities equivalent to the amount withheld as retention (or the retained percentage) in accordance with Public Contract Code section 22300. At the request and expense of the consultant, securities equivalent to the amount withheld shall be deposited with the public agency, or with a state or federally chartered bank in this state as the escrow agent, who shall then pay those moneys to the Consultant. Upon satisfactory completion of the contract, the securities shall be returned to the Consultant.

7. OWNERSHIP OF WRITTEN PRODUCTS

All reports, documents or other written material ("written products" herein) developed by Consultant in the performance of this Agreement shall be and remain the property of City without restriction or limitation upon its use or dissemination by City. Consultant may take and retain copies of such written products as desired, but no such written products shall be the subject of a copyright application by Consultant.

8. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Consultant is, and shall at all times remain as to City, a wholly independent contractor. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of City or otherwise to act on behalf of City as an agent. Neither City nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Agreement. Consultant shall not represent that it is, or that any of its agents or employees are, in any manner employees of City.

9. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY</u>

All data, documents, discussion, or other information developed or received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Agreement are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without prior written consent by City. City shall grant such consent if disclosure is legally required. Upon request, all City data shall be returned to City upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

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10. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

- 10.1 The parties agree that City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers should, to the fullest extent permitted by law, be protected from any and all loss, injury, damage, claim, lawsuit, cost, expense, attorneys' fees, litigation costs, or any other cost arising out of or in any way related to the performance of this Agreement. Accordingly, the provisions of this indemnity provision are intended by the parties to be interpreted and construed to provide the City with the fullest protection possible under the law. Consultant acknowledges that City would not enter into this Agreement in the absence of Consultant's commitment to indemnify and protect City as set forth herein.
- 10.2 To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims and losses, costs or expenses for any damage due to death or injury to any person and injury to any property resulting from any alleged intentional, reckless, negligent, or otherwise wrongful acts, errors or omissions of Consultant or any of its officers, employees, servants, agents, or subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement. Such costs and expenses shall include reasonable attorneys' fees due to counsel of City's choice.
- 10.3 City shall have the right to offset against the amount of any compensation due Consultant under this Agreement any amount due City from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to pay City promptly any indemnification arising under this Section 10 and related to Consultant's failure to either (i) pay taxes on amounts received pursuant to this Agreement or (ii) comply with applicable workers' compensation laws.
- 10.4 The obligations of Consultant under this Section 10 will not be limited by the provisions of any workers' compensation act or similar act. Consultant expressly waives its statutory immunity under such statutes or laws as to City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers.
- 10.5 Consultant agrees to obtain executed indemnity agreements with provisions identical to those set forth here in this Section 10 from each and every subcontractor or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. In the event Consultant fails to obtain such indemnity obligations from others as required herein, Consultant agrees to be fully responsible and indemnify, hold harmless and defend City, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers from and against any and all claims and losses, costs or expenses for any damage due to death or injury to any person and injury to any property resulting from any alleged intentional, reckless, negligent, or otherwise wrongful acts, errors or omissions of Consultant's

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subcontractors or any other person or entity involved by, for, with or on behalf of Consultant in the performance of this Agreement. Such costs and expenses shall include reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by counsel of City's choice.

10.6 City does not, and shall not, waive any rights that it may possess against Consultant because of the acceptance by City, or the deposit with City, of any insurance policy or certificate required pursuant to this Agreement. This hold harmless and indemnification provision shall apply regardless of whether or not any insurance policies are determined to be applicable to the claim, demand, damage, liability, loss, cost or expense.

11. <u>INSURANCE</u>

- During the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall carry, maintain, and keep in full force and effect insurance against claims for death or injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with Consultant's performance of this Agreement. Such insurance shall be of the types and in the amounts as set forth below:
 - 11.1.1 Comprehensive General Liability Insurance with coverage limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) including products and operations hazard, contractual insurance, broad form property damage, independent consultants, personal injury, underground hazard, and explosion and collapse hazard where applicable.
 - 11.1.2 Automobile Liability Insurance for vehicles used in connection with the performance of this Agreement with minimum limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claimant and One Million dollars (\$1,000,000) per incident.
 - 11.1.3 Worker's Compensation insurance as required by the laws of the State of California, including but not limited to California Labor Code § 1860 and 1861 as follows:

Contractor shall take out and maintain, during the life of this contract, Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of Contractor's employees employed at the site of improvement; and, if any work is sublet, Contractor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by Contractor. Contractor and any of Contractor's subcontractors shall be required to provide City with a written statement acknowledging its obligation to secure payment of Worker's Compensation Insurance as required by

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Labor Code § 1861; to wit: 'I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract.' If any class of employees engaged in work under this contract at the site of the Project is not protected under any Worker's Compensation law, Contractor shall provide and shall cause each subcontractor to provide adequate insurance for the protection of employees not otherwise protected. Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless City for any damage resulting from failure of either Contractor or any subcontractor to take out or maintain such insurance.

- 11.1.4 Professional Errors and Omissions Insurance with coverage limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000).
- 11.2 Consultant shall require each of its subcontractors to maintain insurance coverage that meets all of the requirements of this Agreement.
- 11.3 The policy or policies required by this Agreement shall be issued by an insurer admitted in the State of California and with a rating of at least A:VII in the latest edition of Best's Insurance Guide.
- 11.4 Consultant agrees that if it does not keep the aforesaid insurance in full force and effect, City may either (i) immediately terminate this Agreement; or (ii) take out the necessary insurance and pay, at Consultant's expense, the premium thereon.
- 11.5 At all times during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall maintain on file with City's Risk Manager a certificate or certificates of insurance showing that the aforesaid policies are in effect in the required amounts and naming the City and its officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds. Consultant shall, prior to commencement of work under this Agreement, file with City's Risk Manager such certificate(s).
- 11.6 Consultant shall provide proof that policies of insurance required herein expiring during the term of this Agreement have been renewed or replaced with other policies providing at least the same coverage. Such proof will be furnished at least two weeks prior to the expiration of the coverages.
- 11.7 The General Liability Policy of insurance required by this Agreement shall contain an endorsement naming City and its officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds. The General Liability Policy required under this Agreement shall contain an endorsement providing that the policies cannot be

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canceled or reduced except on thirty days' prior written notice to City. Consultant agrees to require its insurer to modify the certificates of insurance to delete any exculpatory wording stating that failure of the insurer to mail written notice of cancellation imposes no obligation, and to delete the word "endeavor" with regard to any notice provisions.

- 11.8 The insurance provided by Consultant shall be primary to any coverage available to City. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by City and/or its officers, employees, agents or volunteers, shall be in excess of Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 11.9 All insurance coverage provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not prohibit Consultant, and Consultant's employees, agents or subcontractors, from waiving the right of subrogation prior to a loss. Consultant hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the City.
- 11.10 Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. At the option of City, Consultant shall either reduce or eliminate the deductibles or self-insured retentions with respect to City, or Consultant shall procure a bond or other security acceptable to the City guaranteeing payment of losses and expenses.
- 11.11 Procurement of insurance by Consultant shall not be construed as a limitation of Consultant's liability or as full performance of Consultant's duties to indemnify, hold harmless and defend under Section 10 of this Agreement.

12. MUTUAL COOPERATION

- 12.1 City shall provide Consultant with all pertinent data, documents and other requested information as is reasonably available for the proper performance of Consultant's services under this Agreement.
- 12.2 In the event any claim or action is brought against City relating to Consultant's performance in connection with this Agreement, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance that City may require.

13. RECORDS AND INSPECTIONS

Consultant shall maintain full and accurate records with respect to all matters covered under this Agreement for a period of three years after the expiration or termination of this Agreement. City shall have the right to access and examine such records, without charge, during normal business hours. City shall further have the right to audit such records, to make transcripts

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that City Council introduce Ordinance No. 2017-357, which proposes to correct an error and remove the word "residential" from Article X and Part B of Calabasas Municipal Code Section 15.04.600.

BACKGROUND:

On October 8, 2015, the Governor of California signed Assembly Bill 126 into law which required the City to adopt an Ordinance to establish an expedited permitting process for electrical vehicle charging stations by no later than September 30, 2017. In response to the new law (and as an inclusion to the triennial updates to the California Building Standards Codes), staff prepared a staff report and Ordinance 2017-349 which included an expedited electrical vehicle charging station permitting program. Council adopted the Ordinance on February 22, 2017. Inadvertently in the Ordinance, staff had inserted the word "residential" before the phrase electrical vehicle charging stations.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

The intent of Assembly Bill 1236 was to have an expedited permitting process for all electrical vehicle charging stations regardless of the occupancy types for which they were proposed. Upon a review of the law while crafting educational information for the City Website, Building and Safety staff noticed the following passage from the Bill:

"... The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:

... The implementation of consistent statewide standards to achieve the timely and cost-effective installation of electric vehicle charging stations is not a municipal affair, as that term is used in Section 5 of Article XI of the California Constitution, but is instead a matter of statewide concern.

It is the intent of the Legislature that local agencies not adopt ordinances that create unreasonable barriers to the installation of electric vehicle charging stations and not unreasonably restrict the ability of homeowners and agricultural and business concerns to install electric vehicle charging stations..."

It is very clear that the Assembly Bill was not limited to electrical vehicle charging stations.

The sole amendment proposed to Article X and Part B of Section 15.04.600 of the Calabasas Municipal Code is identified by the following strike troughed words:

Article X Expedited permitting process for: Small residential rooftop solar energy systems and residential electrical vehicle charging stations.

Part B Expedited permitting process for residential vehicle charging stations.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS, CALIFORNIA, REVISING CITY OF CALABASAS ORDINANCE 2017-349 - CALABASAS MUNICIPAL CODE ARTICLE 10 SECTION 15.04.600, REVISING THE EXPEDITED PERMITTING PROCEDURES FOR ELECTRICAL VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS.

WHEREAS, Citing the desire to foster a "modernized and standardized permitting process" for electrical vehicle charging stations, the State Legislature recently passed AB 1236; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 17951 (e) of the Health and Safety Code, local regulations necessary to carry out the application of the California Building Standards Code (CBSC) that do not establish building standards may be enacted without meeting the requirements of California Health & Safety Code sections 18941.5, 17958, 17598.5 and 17958.7; and

WHEREAS, no part of this Ordinance imposes a more restrictive California Code Standard based upon local climatic, geographical or topographical findings and proposed amendments are solely intended to create administrative processes to comply with Section (a) of Section 65850.7 of the California Government Code; and

WHEREAS, Subsection (a) of Section 65850.7 of the California Government Code, declares the implementation of consistent statewide standards to achieve the timely and cost-effective installation of electric vehicle charging stations systems is not a municipal affair, but is instead a matter of statewide concern; and

WHEREAS, Subsection (a) of Section 65850.7 of the California Government Code provides that it is the policy of the State to promote and encourage the installation and use of all electrical vehicle charging systems by limiting obstacles to their use and by minimizing the permitting costs of such systems; and

WHEREAS, Subdivision (g)(1) of Section 65850.7 of the California Government Code provides that, on or before September 30, 2017, every city, county, or city and county with a population of less than 200,000 people shall adopt an ordinance, consistent with the goals and intent of subdivision (a) of Section 65850.7, that creates an expedited, streamlined permitting process for electrical vehicle charging stations systems; and

WHEREAS, The intent of this proposed Ordinance is to comply with Section 65850.7 (a) of the California Government Code in order to implement an expedited, streamlined permitting process for electrical vehicular charging stations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council does hereby further find that in accordance with section 15061(b)(3) of the California Code of Regulations, the adoption of this local amendment to the CBSC, and amendments to the Calabasas Municipal Code are exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act because such actions are administrative in nature as the actions amend an expedited permitting process for electric vehicle charging stations as required by statute and will not adversely affect the environment in any manner through promoting the development of electric vehicle charging stations;

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALABASAS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

SECTION 1. The title section of Article X of the Calabasas Municipal Code is hereby revised to read as follows:

Article X Expedited permitting process for: Small residential rooftop solar energy systems and electrical vehicle charging stations.

SECTION 2. The title section of 15.04.600 PART B is hereby revised to read as follows:

- Part B Expedited permitting process for vehicle charging stations.
- **SECTION 3.** Changes Are Administrative in Nature The City Council hereby finds and determines that this amendment to the Building Standards Code is an administrative change for which no findings need be legally made.
- SECTION 4. References in Documents and Continuing Legal Effect. References to prior versions of any portion of the Building Standards Code, or of the Calabasas Municipal Code that are amended in this Municipal Code, that are cited on notices issued by the City or other documents of ongoing or continuing legal effect, including resolutions adopting or imposing fees or charges, until converted, are deemed to be references to the Building Standards Code or amended Municipal Code sections for the purposes of notice and enforcement. The provisions adopted hereby shall not in any manner affect deposits, established fees or other matters of record which refer to, or are otherwise connected with, ordinances which are specifically designated by number, code section or otherwise, but such references

shall be deemed to apply to the corresponding provisions set forth in the code sections adopted or amended hereby.

SECTION 5. Continuity. To the extent the provisions of this Ordinance are substantially the same as previous provisions of the Calabasas Municipal Code, these provisions shall be construed as continuations of those provisions and not as new enactments.

SECTION 6. No Effect on Enforceability. The repeal of any sections of the Municipal Code, shall not affect or impair any act done, or right vested or approved, or any proceeding, suit or prosecution had or commenced in any cause before such repeal shall take effect; but every such act, vested right, proceeding, suit, or prosecution shall remain in full force and effect for all purposes as if the applicable provisions of the Municipal Code, or part thereof, had remained in force and effect. No offense committed and no liability, penalty, or forfeiture, either civil or criminal, incurred prior to the repeal or alteration of any applicable provision of the 2016 Code, shall be affected by this ordinance

SECTION 6. CEQA. This Ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to State Guidelines §15061 (b) (3) as a project that has no potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

SECTION 7. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be processed in the manner required by law.

SECTION 8. Building Standards Commission. The City Clerk shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the California Building Standards Commission.

SECTION 9. Severability. Should any section, subsection, clause, or provision of this Ordinance for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this Ordinance; it being hereby expressly declared that this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, and phrase hereof would have been adopted irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 10. Publication. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published in accordance with California Government Code Section 36933, shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance, and shall cause this Ordinance and its certification, together with proof of publication, to be entered in the Book of Ordinances of the City Council.

Assembly Bill No. 1236

CHAPTER 598

An act to add Section 65850.7 to the Government Code, relating to local ordinances.

[Approved by Governor October 8, 2015. Filed with Secretary of State October 8, 2015.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1236, Chiu. Local ordinances: electric vehicle charging stations.

The Planning and Zoning Law, among other things, requires the legislative body of each county and city to adopt a general plan for the physical development of the county or city and authorizes the adoption and administration of zoning laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations by counties and cities. Existing law, the Electric Vehicle Charging Stations Open Access Act, prohibits the charging of a subscription fee on persons desiring to use an electric vehicle charging station, as defined, and prohibits a requirement for persons to obtain membership in any club, association, or organization as a condition of using the station, except as specified.

The bill would require a city, county, or city and county to approve an application for the installation of electric vehicle charging stations, as defined, through the issuance of specified permits unless the city or county makes specified written findings based upon substantial evidence in the record that the proposed installation would have a specific, adverse impact upon the public health or safety, and there is no feasible method to satisfactorily mitigate or avoid the specific, adverse impact. The bill would provide for appeal of that decision to the planning commission, as specified. The bill would provide that the implementation of consistent statewide standards to achieve the timely and cost-effective installation of electric vehicle charging stations is a matter of statewide concern. The bill would require electric vehicle charging stations to meet specified standards. The bill would require a city, county, or city and county with a population of 200,000 or more residents to adopt an ordinance, by September 30, 2016, that creates an expedited and streamlined permitting process for electric vehicle charging stations, as specified. The bill would require a city, county, or city and county with a population of less than 200,000 residents to adopt this ordinance by September 30, 2017. The bill would authorize the city, county, or city and county, in developing the ordinance, to refer to guidelines contained in a specified guidebook. The bill would also authorize the adoption of an ordinance that modifies the checklists and standards found in the guidebook due to unique conditions. By increasing the duties of local officials, this bill would create a state-mandated local program.

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The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 65850.7 is added to the Government Code, to read: 65850.7. (a) The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:

- (1) The implementation of consistent statewide standards to achieve the timely and cost-effective installation of electric vehicle charging stations is not a municipal affair, as that term is used in Section 5 of Article XI of the California Constitution, but is instead a matter of statewide concern.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that local agencies not adopt ordinances that create unreasonable barriers to the installation of electric vehicle charging stations and not unreasonably restrict the ability of homeowners and agricultural and business concerns to install electric vehicle charging stations.
- (3) It is the policy of the state to promote and encourage the use of electric vehicle charging stations and to limit obstacles to their use.
- (4) It is the intent of the Legislature that local agencies comply not only with the language of this section, but also the legislative intent to encourage the installation of electric vehicle charging stations by removing obstacles to, and minimizing costs of, permitting for charging stations so long as the action does not supersede the building official's authority to identify and address higher priority life-safety situations.
- (b) A city, county, or city and county shall administratively approve an application to install electric vehicle charging stations through the issuance of a building permit or similar nondiscretionary permit. Review of the application to install an electric vehicle charging station shall be limited to the building official's review of whether it meets all health and safety requirements of local, state, and federal law. The requirements of local law shall be limited to those standards and regulations necessary to ensure that the electric vehicle charging station will not have a specific, adverse impact upon the public health or safety. However, if the building official of the city, county, or city and county makes a finding, based on substantial evidence, that the electric vehicle charging station could have a specific, adverse impact upon the public health or safety, the city, county, or city and county may require the applicant to apply for a use permit.
- (c) A city, county, or city and county may not deny an application for a use permit to install an electric vehicle charging station unless it makes written findings based upon substantial evidence in the record that the proposed installation would have a specific, adverse impact upon the public health or safety, and there is no feasible method to satisfactorily mitigate or avoid the specific, adverse impact. The findings shall include the basis

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for the rejection of potential feasible alternatives of preventing the adverse impact.

- (d) The decision of the building official pursuant to subdivisions (b) and (c) may be appealed to the planning commission of the city, county, or city and county.
- (e) Any conditions imposed on an application to install an electric vehicle charging station shall be designed to mitigate the specific, adverse impact upon the public health or safety at the lowest cost possible.
- (f) (1) An electric vehicle charging station shall meet applicable health and safety standards and requirements imposed by state and local permitting authorities.
- (2) An electric vehicle charging station shall meet all applicable safety and performance standards established by the California Electrical Code, the Society of Automotive Engineers, the National Electrical Manufacturers Association, and accredited testing laboratories such as Underwriters Laboratories and, where applicable, rules of the Public Utilities Commission regarding safety and reliability.
- (g) (1) On or before September 30, 2016, every city, county, or city and county with a population of 200,000 or more residents, and, on or before September 30, 2017, every city, county, or city and county with a population of less than 200,000 residents, shall, in consultation with the local fire department or district and the utility director, if the city, county, or city and county operates a utility, adopt an ordinance, consistent with the goals and intent of this section, that creates an expedited, streamlined permitting process for electric vehicle charging stations. In developing an expedited permitting process, the city, county, or city and county shall adopt a checklist of all requirements with which electric vehicle charging stations shall comply to be eligible for expedited review. An application that satisfies the information requirements in the checklist, as determined by the city, county, or city and county, shall be deemed complete. Upon confirmation by the city, county, or city and county of the application and supporting documents being complete and meeting the requirements of the checklist, and consistent with the ordinance, a city, county, or city and county shall, consistent with subdivision (b), approve the application and issue all required permits or authorizations. However, the city, county, or city and county may establish a process to prioritize competing applications for expedited permits. Upon receipt of an incomplete application, a city, county, or city and county shall issue a written correction notice detailing all deficiencies in the application and any additional information required to be eligible for expedited permit issuance. An application submitted to a city, county, or city and county that owns and operates an electric utility shall demonstrate compliance with the utility's interconnection policies prior to approval.
- (2) The checklist and required permitting documentation shall be published on a publicly accessible Internet Web site, if the city, county, or city and county has an Internet Web site, and the city, county, or city and county shall allow for electronic submittal of a permit application and associated documentation, and shall authorize the electronic signature on

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all forms, applications, and other documentation in lieu of a wet signature by an applicant. In developing the ordinance, the city, county, or city and county may refer to the recommendations contained in the most current version of the "Plug-In Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Permitting Checklist" of the "Zero-Emission Vehicles in California: Community Readiness Guidebook" published by the Office of Planning and Research. A city, county, or city and county may adopt an ordinance that modifies the checklists and standards found in the guidebook due to unique climactic, geological, seismological, or topographical conditions. If a city, county, or city and county determines that it is unable to authorize the acceptance of an electronic signature on all forms, applications, and other documents in lieu of a wet signature by an applicant, the city, county, or city and county shall state, in the ordinance required under this subdivision, the reasons for its inability to accept electronic signatures and acceptance of an electronic signature shall not be required.

- (h) A city, county, or city and county shall not condition approval for any electric vehicle charging station permit on the approval of an electric vehicle charging station by an association, as that term is defined in Section 4080 of the Civil Code.
 - (i) The following definitions shall apply to this section:
- (1) "A feasible method to satisfactorily mitigate or avoid the specific, adverse impact" includes, but is not limited to, any cost-effective method, condition, or mitigation imposed by a city, county, or city and county on another similarly situated application in a prior successful application for a permit.
- (2) "Electronic submittal" means the utilization of one or more of the following:
 - (A) Email.
 - (B) The Internet.
 - (C) Facsimile.
- (3) "Electric vehicle charging station" or "charging station" means any level of electric vehicle supply equipment station that is designed and built in compliance with Article 625 of the California Electrical Code, as it reads on the effective date of this section, and delivers electricity from a source outside an electric vehicle into a plug-in electric vehicle.
- (4) "Specific, adverse impact" means a significant, quantifiable, direct, and unavoidable impact, based on objective, identified, and written public health or safety standards, policies, or conditions as they existed on the date the application was deemed complete.
- SEC. 2. No reimbursement is required by this act pursuant to Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution because a local agency or school district has the authority to levy service charges, fees, or assessments sufficient to pay for the program or level of service mandated by this act, within the meaning of Section 17556 of the Government Code.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council considers the Planning Commission's recommendations regarding Community Development Forums, and provides direction to Staff.

BACKGROUND:

At their meeting of June 28, 2017, the City Council considered introduction of Ordinance No. 2017-353, amending Chapter 17.60 of the Calabasas Municipal Code by adding a new section, 17.60.055, to require applicants/developers of certain larger development projects to conduct Community Development Forums prior to formal consideration of the project by official decision making bodies.

During discussion of this item, the City Council determined that they wished to have the Planning Commission review the Forum Guidelines and submit comments and recommendations for the Council's consideration.

DISCUSSION:

The Planning Commission conducted extensive reviews of the Community Development Forum Guidelines at their meetings of July 20, August 3 and August 17, 2017. The Commission's recommendations are hereby submitted to the City Council for consideration as Attachment A.

Commissioner Washburn dissented from the opinion of his colleagues, and recommends against the establishment of Community Development Forums at this time. He strongly encouraged that the Council consider a different engagement approach, and conduct public workshops to update relevant City Plans (e.g. the General Plan, Las Virgenes Gateway Plan, West Calabasas Road Master Plan, etc.) for key sites. Commissioner Washburn argued that absent updates to those documents, which are required to be used by Staff and decision making bodies to evaluate projects, the City was placing itself in an awkward legal and political position if Forums conducted for certain projects and properties would result in proposals far afield from adopted City policies and standards.

All Commissioners were in agreement that the Forums could set unrealistic or unreasonable expectations by members of the public regarding their ability (via the forum process) to shape, influence or demand project development in ways which differ from adopted City plans and codes.

FISCAL IMPACT/SOURCE OF FUNDING:

Staff time for the preparation of reports and meeting attendance related to the development of this ordinance are provided for under the FY17/18 annual budget.

REQUESTED ACTION:

That the City Council considers the Planning Commission's recommendations regarding Community Development Forums, and provides direction to Staff.

Calabasas Planning Commission Recommendations

Community Engagement: Community Development Forum Guidelines

Based upon reviews at the Planning Commission meetings of July 20, August 3 and August 17' 2017, the following recommendations are submitted to the City Council for consideration regarding the Community Development Forum Guidelines:

Summary of Comments and Recommendations:

- 1) The requirement to conduct two Forums has strong merit. They are correctly positioned in the application process, allowing both the earliest opportunity to inform the public of a pending project, and consider public comments and suggestions.
- 2) Forums for smaller-scale projects, such as additions to existing commercial uses, should be waived because the desired "clean slate" charrette approach of Forum #1 cannot be accomplished in such circumstances.
- 3) The Forums should be less structured than presently described, and offer greater flexibility to the applicant in structuring their public engagement. To accomplish this, the Commission suggests that the list of materials, reports, and information for the first forum be broken into two subsets: a list of required items, and a list of encouraged items. From the eight-item list (on page 3 of the Guidelines), items 2, 3, 4, 7, & 8 should be required, while the remaining items should be encouraged.
- 4) A well-written "statement of purpose", which clearly states what the public should expect during and after the Forum, is <u>essential</u> to be developed. It should be a City developed statement, be included within the Guidelines, included in all notices for project forums, and be a required introductory statement by the project developer at beginning of each Forum. Following is a draft "**Statement of Purpose**":

The City of Calabasas requires that this Community Development Forum be conducted for the following reasons.

- 1) This Forum is an opportunity to inform the public at the eariest stage possible that a development project may be proposed for the area.
- 2) Because the development project being discussed may be one that could have an effect, benefit, impact or contribution to your neighborhood, the City believes that community engagement and outreach is important.
- 3) The City of Calabasas believes that an informal exchange of project information, together with ideas and concerns from the public, can result in superior projects.
- 4) This Forum is not a formally noticed "public hearing", and no decisions will be made at the forum. Neither is there any obligation for the City or the Property Owner to adopt or incorporate ideas and suggestions which arise and are discussed at the Forum.
- 5) To improve consistency and to clarify the City Council's intent and expectations some editing is needed for those Guideline sections which include the words "shall", "should", or "may". It is recommended that any accepted guideline revisions by the Council go back to the Planning Commission for editing by a Task Force of the Commission, after which the edited document would be considered by the full Planning Commission and the City Council.
- 6) The *defined terms* at the end of the Guidelines merit refinement to improve document clarity. For example, the term "stakeholder" is too broad, and can arguably apply to every person in the City.
- 7) The Commission voiced some concerns about compliance with the required elements of the two Forums. What should happen when a specified step is missed or not executed precisely as written? Who determines that a

required step was not taken or that a deadline was missed? And what should be the appropriate (and legal) consequences? The Planning Commission requests that the City Council provide guidance in this regard so that it may be crafted into the final ordinace.

- 8) While the Commission understands the reasoning behind the use of first person sentence construction (to present and communicate the guidelines in a less formal tone), the Commission suggests re-writing those sections in a more standard passive voice (e.g., 3rd-person) as part of an ordinance adoption.
- 9) Strengthen the Forum waiver process by clarifying which types of projects should be eligible for a waiver, and which types of projects should not be deemed eligible.
- 10) Finally (and although this item is not based upon a concensus of the Commission as a whole), the Council is invited to consider the alternative approach of having more significant development projects apply for a Pre-Application review, per the existing Development Code and General Plan, with such review to occur before either the Planning Commission &/or the City Council.
