Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Rouse purchased this lot in Calabasas Park and hired renowned architect Jerrold Lomax to design them a glass house that would showcase their spectacular views of the valley. They also entertained frequently and wanted the outdoor spaces to be merged with the indoor spaces.

The Rouses also owned Trailer Life Publications, which specialized in magazines geared towards the owners of Recreational Vehicles (RVs). Their headquarters in Agoura Hills was also designed by Mr. Lomax.

The Rouse Residence is the only example of Lomax's work using Glu-lam beams. It also utilizes long, uninterrupted glass walls, and a feeling of combining the outdoors with the interior of the dwelling, which are all integral to Lomax's design. It is an excellent example of the International/Modern style of architecture and the Midcentury Modern period of design.

Jerrold Lomax was a renown modern architect and referred to one of the "Los Angeles 12" a group of architects noted for their significant architectural contributions and potential" (Jerrold E. Lomax, FAIA, The First 80 Years guidebook for MODAA Gallery exhibition, October 2007).. Having been designated a member of this austere group; Lomax exhibited his work in an exhibition at the MODAA Gallery at Studio Pali Fekete architects in celebration of his architectural style and contributions. Lomax's work is regarded as an important contribution to the architectural fabric of Southern California and his name is associated with such luminaries from the architecture field as: Frank Gehry, Craig Ellwood, Ray Kappe, Cesar Pelli, Anthony Lumsden, John Lautner, Daniel Dworsky, Leroy Miller, James Pulliam and Bernard Zimmerman.
