## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- The City provides <u>Public Transit Services only</u>. Public Transit Services are not the same as School Buses. These services are open to the public.
- Every passenger must present a valid pass to board a vehicle. No pass, no ride, no exceptions.
- A Transit Pass is \$154.00 and is valid from August 21, 2024 through June 11, 2025.
- A \$32 fee will be charged for replacement of lost, stolen, or broken pass.
- A pass does not guarantee a seat. It permits boarding of a transit vehicle.
- If transit vehicle is full, riders will need to wait for additional transit vehicle to arrive.
- Passengers are required to board the vehicle only at the curb at the designated bus stops, and must allow other passengers to exit first.
- All Passengers must remain seated while the vehicle is in motion.
- Passengers must hold small children securely during the trip.
- If occupancy requires standing, passengers must remain behind the white line located at either door of the vehicle and hold onto the overhead railings.
- The City of Calabasas does not supervise transit stops and is not responsible for conduct of riders at a shuttle stops.
- The following activities are prohibited on the transit vehicle:
- Smoking/vaping
- Eating
- Drinking, including consumption of alcohol
- Running
- Littering
- Loud or intrusive use of profanity/obscenities
- Disorderly conduct including threatening or harassing behavior to other passengers and drivers
- Conduct that could pose a threat to public safety (exposure to bodily fluids, pathogens)
- Solicitation for commercial or noncommercial purposes

- Vandalism, graffiti
- Taking up more than one seat
- Placement of feet upon seats
- Inappropriate/distracting conversation with the driver
- Listening to electronic equipment without use of headsets.
- (Calabasas Transit Service Provider reserves the right to ask any passenger to turn their equipment off for the safety and/or comfort of other riders)
- Remaining on the bus for an extended period of time with no expectation of departing for a destination.

- Occupying a shelter with no expectation of catching a transit vehicle
- Sleeping on the bus or in the bus shelters
- Traveling with pets with the exception of service animals trained to assist individuals with disabilities
- Opening the windows without the permission of the driver
- Placing hands, arms, heads, or personal belongings outside of the transit vehicle.

- The following items are not allowed on the transit vehicle:
- Hazardous materials (e.g., car batteries, gasoline cans or other flammable materials)
- Firearms or other weapons
- Items that would block the aisle or require the use of an additional seat if the use of an additional seat would deprive a passenger of a seat
- Items too large or too numerous to be reasonably controlled, carried, or handled by a passenger
- Strollers and/or shopping carts that cannot be folded and stored safely
- Open containers of alcoholic beverages, drink, or food.
  - The City is not responsible for lost or stolen personal belongings.
